

MISSIONARY MOTHER MAE ANNIE MILLER fondly known as "Brady" was born on May 8, 1929, in Scooba, MS, to the union of the late Willie and Mary E. Liza Stidmon. The third child of nine, four preceded her in death: three sisters, Willie "Olivia" Spates, Annie Mae Nickerson, and Frances Lipson; and one brother, JT Stidmon.

Missionary Mother Mae Annie Miller's parents were sharecroppers and worked in the fields picking cotton. She was expected to work and to pick cotton, and she was only able to get a six grade education due to the depression during this time. Her mother would try to help her more but her father enforced no education, for fear of what could happen to his family if they were not working productively.

In 1944, Missionary Mother Mae Annie Miller was united in holy matrimony to the late Roosevelt Carter Sr. She had nine children and four preceded her in death, Nettie Johnson, Eddie Bell, Roosevelt, Jr., and Otis Carter.

In 1953, she decided to start a new journey and moved her family to St. Louis, MO. She was employed at the Normandy Hospital in laundry services and other similar jobs during that time. Eager to finish her education, she enrolled in an adult night school where she received a certification of participation.

She confessed a hope in Christ at an early age. After moving to St. Louis, MO she connected with Calvary Baptist Church, Zion Travels Baptist Church and West End Mt. Caramel Baptist Church, where she became a member under the leadership of the late Rev. Arthur Mitchell. In 1970, wanting to secure her spiritual growth she took her three youngest children to a revival at Elijah Temple Church of God in Christ where she received the baptism of the Holy Spirit. It was then that she decided to expand her mind with more spiritual growth, and she enrolled in a Bible class. She studied the entire Bible in two years. After completion of her class, she became a licensed missionary under the Church of God in Christ Inc.

With Missionary Mother Mae Annie Miller's motivation and determination in making a better life not just for her immediate family, she also wanted to give her parents, siblings, and extended family the opportunity to experience a better life as well. She coordinated with her parents and siblings, Vera and France (Liz) to move to St. Louis. Although they had never left out of Mississippi, they decided to move with all their children. Throughout the years she was very instrumental in making a way for other members of the family to join her in St. Louis, MO. With this new found freedom and her desire, her prayer was that her entire family received Christ as their savior.

In 1974, she joined New Bible Days Church of God in Christ under the leadership of Archbishop Johnny Jones. She served for many years there and held many positions including: the missionary board, Superintendent of the Sunday School Dept., church announcer, supervisor of the children's choir, and was later appointed to the mother's board.

In September 1977, she married the late Reverend Isaac Miller, who preceded her in death.

Missionary Mother Mae Annie Miller worked as a Foster grandmother and retired twice. She received the late Nancy Reagan Award for grandmother of the year. The award provided her with an interview with the St. Louis Post Dispatch and a special segment on the evening news with Benita Cornute on KTVI Channel 2 news about her life story.

In 2006, Missionary Mother Mae Annie Miller's youngest daughter and husband started the Healing Waters Ministry. She joined and served with her daughter as the founding Mother of the Church until her death.


