## Life Reflection

Trey Wash Chinn was born in Laurel, Mississippi, on May 15, 1983, to Algernon and Addie Chinn. Trey was a life-long resident of Laurel and remained dedicated to its progress until he transitioned to be with his Heavenly Father on November 23, 2019 at St. Dominic Hospital in Jackson, Mississippi. He was a proud 2001 graduate and Hall of Famer of the R.H. Watkins High School. Trey earned a degree in Rhetoric and Political Science from Wabash College.

Trey, though young, lived an extraordinary life as a servant for those that he held closest to his heart - his family, friends, and his community. Trey was a member of Queens Chapel Baptist Church and frequently attended St. Paul's United Methodist Church. Trey has been actively engaged for over 20 years, since he was 14 years old, by participating and leading the R.H. Watkins Young Democrats and becoming very active with voter registration. While in high school, Trey was the State Secretary for Young Democrats of Mississippi and he was also elected LT. Governor at Mississippi Boys State. In addition, he has served in multiple capacities as an adult, including, but not limited to Laurel City Councilman of Ward 7, President of the Laurel-Jones County Branch of the NAACP, Deputy Commissioner with the Jones County Soil and Water Commission, Executive Chairman of the Jones County Democrats, Vice-President of Mississippi Black Caucus of Local Elected Officials, Committee member of Mississippi Municipal League Legislative Committee, City of Laurel Cable Board, Laurel Jones County Fair Commission, and 2nd Vice President of the National Oak Park High School Alumni Association. Trey was also an active member on both the Mississippi NAACP and Mississippi Democratic Party state executive committees. In 2018, Trey was a graduate of the inaugural NAACP NextGen Leadership Program where he was a valuable asset to a nationwide cohort of young professionals. In addition to all of these things, Trey was frequently a consultant on a number of community projects and campaigns as well as a trusted friend to many.

Fearlessly and tirelessly, Trey continued to be a living example of what it means to truly love your community and the people in it. This is only a fraction of what Trey has accomplished in his 36 years on earth but in keeping Trey's spirit alive and carrying on his legacy, Trey would want to take this opportunity to encourage all of us to roll up our sleeves and get involved.
