Christine received her Christian training from St. Mary Missionary Baptist Church in Jacob City, Florida; New Bethel Missionary Baptist Church in Port St. Joe; and at Zion Fair Missionary Baptist Church in Port St. Joe, Florida.

Christine attended and graduated from Washington High/Elementary School through the Gulf County School System. Though she encountered many obstacles as a single parent she was determined to fulfill her goals within the nursing field, so she furthered her education by completing and earning a nursing assistance certificate and a LPN certificate. Her kindhearted, generous, and caring spirit to all people can be attributed to her career achievement from domestic worker to healthcare worker.

She is preceded in death by her special daughter Eloise; her father, Daddy Crawford; her mother, Carrie; sisters Carrie Bell, Lula Lee, Betty Jean, and Brother Eugene.

Mrs. Colvin was influenced by her family to be a loving and caring woman, always giving her time to others, and she incorporated that into her motherhood.
