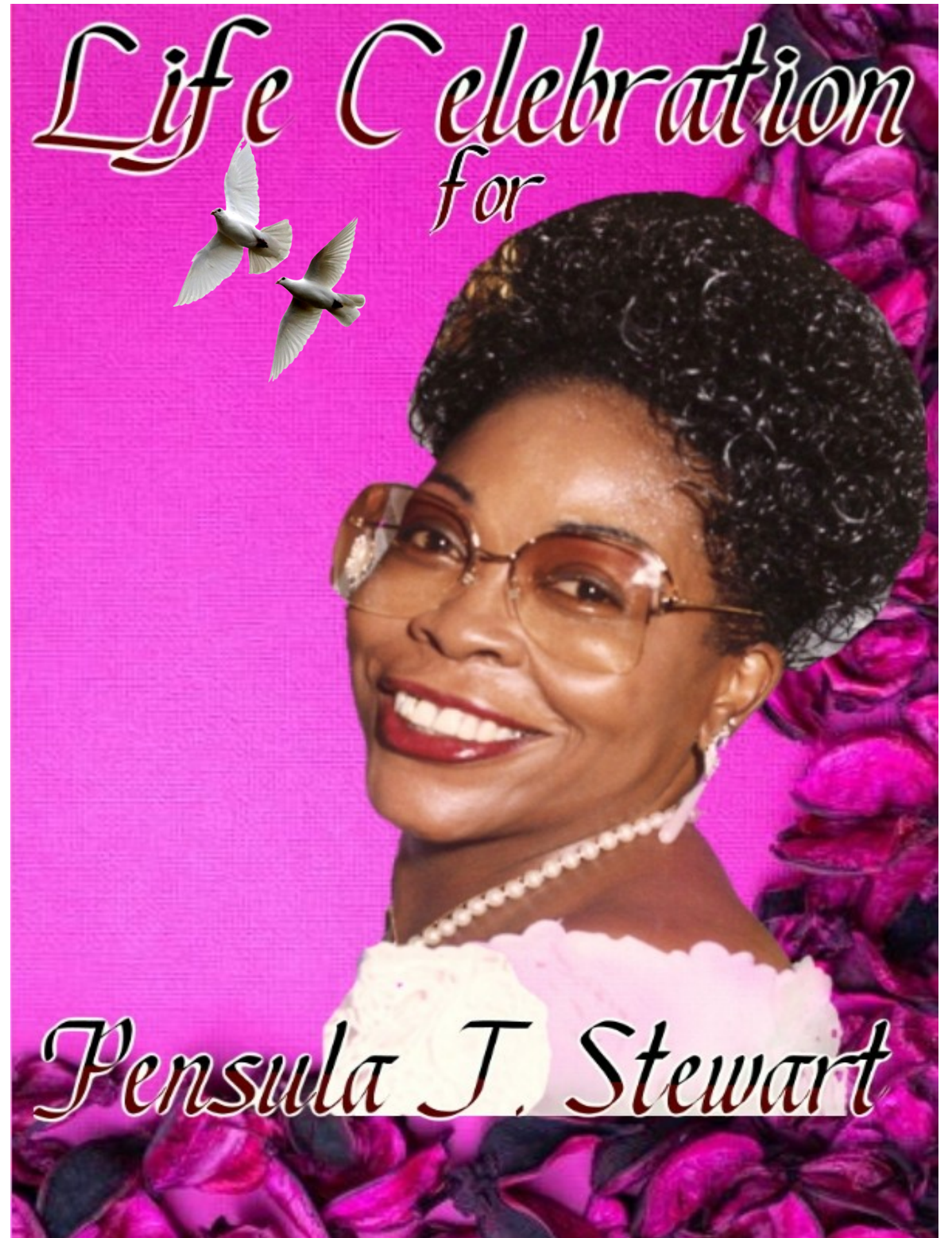

#### *A Time to Build*

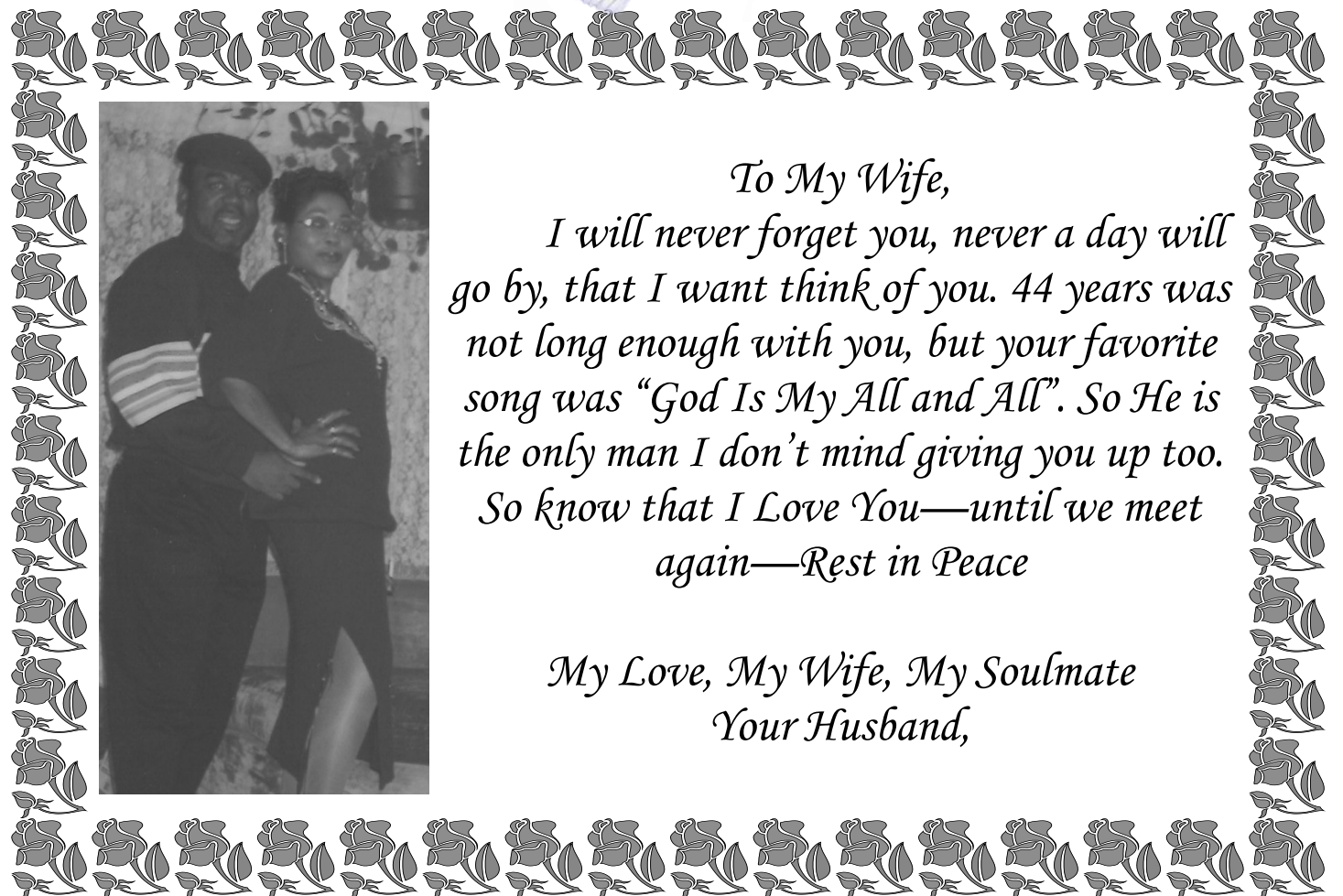
