She became bedridden in 1984 and within the first 15 years of her illness she had a stroke that left her permanently paralyzed. She then moved to Florida with her two sons, Melvin and Cory. From the beginning of her illness until the time of her passing, her one and only caretaker, Carolyn (CEE CEE) followed her every step of the way.
