Holly had a great memory. She could recall all her sibling's birthdays and never missed an opportunity to remind them about the approaching

day. Holly memorized phone numbers and would not hesitate in giving you a call early morning, noon or night. It would not be uncommon to get a call from Holly at 3:00 am just to talk. We will miss those early morning wake-up calls.

Holly loved giving God praise rather it was through a dance, when she was able to stand on her feet or clap her hands. She also loved singing gospel songs with her sister Lydia. Amongst her favorites were "I'm a Soldier" and "I'm Building a Home".

Holly never met a stranger and delighted everyone with her joyful spirit and witty personality. She was always concerned about the well-being of others. When Holly was in the hospital, she called mom to say, "God is Good, he brought me out the woods!" Holly always gave God credit and praise for his excellence. Despite how sick Holly became, she lived everyday with joy. She never showed her illness on her face. She would simply smile and say, God is Good!
