# A Legacy of Life

Ann Nora Salters Hall was born on May 13, 1933 in Satillo, Mississippi, to the late Eula and Plum Salters. She was raised in Tupelo, Mississippi. She was called to her eternal rest on Saturday, May 2, 2020.

Ann Nora met, and later married Willie James Hall on November 13, 1953. They moved from Mississippi to New York City in 1954. They had four children: two girls and two boys. She was a member of Jefferson Park United Methodist Church in New York City for over twenty years. While a member there, she served on the Choir, Pastor's Aide and the Missionary Board. She and her husband later moved to Amityville, NY in 1984, where she became a member of Grace Community Church, Amityville, NY under the leadership of Pastor Robert L. Burgess.

She loved reading her Bible and the Sunday newspaper. She was the world's best bargain hunter. She loved flowers and gardening. Quilting was her favorite hobby. She loved her grandchildren and great-grandchildren, and they bought her great joy whenever they were around.

Annie was employed by the Amityville, NY Public School System, and also worked with Grumman Aerospace in Bethpage, NY from which she and her husband retired. After her retirement they relocated to Battle Creek, MI, then back to her hometown of Belden, Mississippi, where she attended Hopewell Missionary Baptist Church, under the leadership of Pastor Curtis McKinney. They lived there until her husband became ill and passed.
