

Bishop Simpson married the late Frank Simpson Sr., of McClellanville, South Carolina and from that union there were six children born. Janice Roberson, Mary Harrington (Herbert III), Peggie Smith (John) Frank Simpson, Jr. (Sandra). She was preceded in death by two daughters, Joanne Bennett (John) and Dorothy Mangum (William, Sr.). Bishop Simpson has 20 grandchildren, 44 great grandchildren and 36 great great grandchildren. Bishop Simpson had nine godchildren: Pastor Virginia Dingle, Elder Donald Hooker, Pastors Charles & Kimberly Robinson, Paul Neal Ward, Etha Harris, Aniya Coffield, Ellis Kinney and Neal McKenzie. E – is for Eager. Eager to lead and live for God a true woman of God you are. Here in spirit, So we know you'll never be too far.


L – is for loving. Loving with all of you, sharing and caring is all you did, we will be sure to pass it down to our kids.
