KIMBER H. RAND JR.

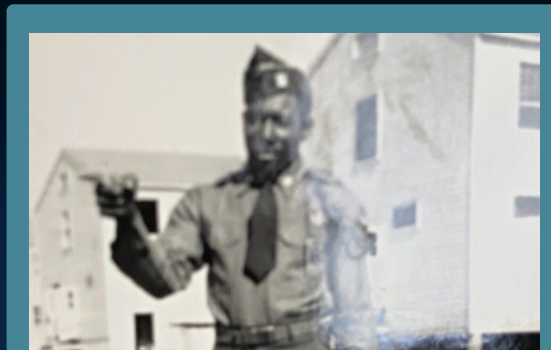

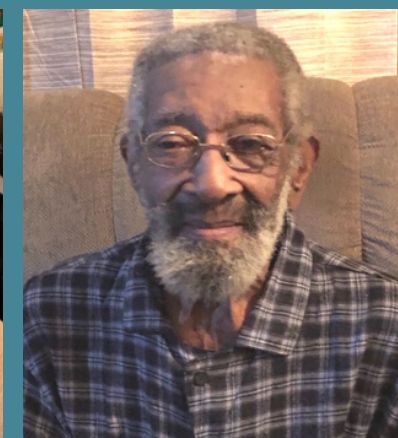
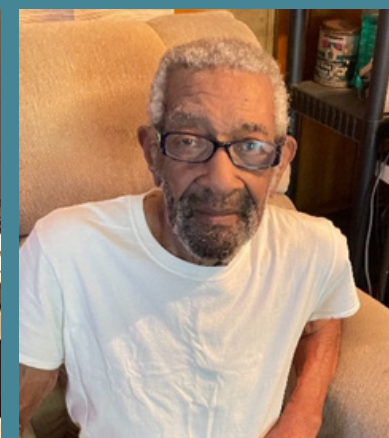
