

Dorothy grew up in Wendell NC where she united with Pleasant Grove Baptist Church as a young child. The family moved to Raleigh and joined Martin Street Baptist Church. Dorothy graduated from Washington High School and attended Shaw University where she met Grady, and they were married in 1952.

Through this union, they raised five children. She was also the First Lady of three churches that Grady pastored (Zion Baptist Church, Everett, MA, Oberlin Baptist Church, Raleigh, NC for 10 years and Union Baptist Church, Durham, NC for 27 years).

As the wife of a civil rights leader, she hosted at her home leaders like Dr. Martin Luther and Coretta Scott King and the Floyd McKissick family. She and Grady were the first blacks to eat in K&W Cafeteria.

Dorothy was a gifted financial and life skills mother and wife! She often found herself cooking meals for many Shaw students, religious leaders and sanitation workers who were in need of a meal! She was often referred to as a very "elegant lady" and had an unbelievable sense of humor.

Dorothy was an exceptional interior designer, tailor and furniture upholster. She learned these skills from her father at a very early age as she hung around him in his shop. She was a one-of-a-kind seamstress and was asked to teach a summer Homemaking class at Fayetteville Technical School.





Dorothy loved to travel and visited many destinations such as the Hawaiian Islands, the Caribbean, Europe, and Greece, to name a few. She also traveled alone for two weeks to assist her son, Mahatma, with business in South Korea and Singapore. She, along with Grady were invited to the White House and met several US Presidents.

From 2017 to 2021, she resided and received home care with her daughter Crystal and family along

with Caregiver Ms. Tristian Crawford. She always thanked her grandson Christopher for all his sacrifices lifting her, helping her exercise, telling daily jokes and companionship.

In 2019, she and her friends celebrated their 90th birthdays together with families and friends.

On May 20, 2021, she was transferred to Fall River Court until her final day.
