"I am the lost and frightened child whose tears you stooped to dry!"


"You're home!" a man said. "Now I can say a grateful word for your prayers beside my sickbed that you thought I never heard!"


Another said, "You gave me more then you could quite afford, and set me on my feet so I could know and serve the Lord!"
