

Luellen Patterson Morgan, daughter of the late Galler and Sarah Thompson Patterson, transitioned to her heavenly home on August 27, 2021.


Luellen was born on December 11, 1920 in Rocky Grove, South Carolina, and was educated in Orangeburg County public school system.


