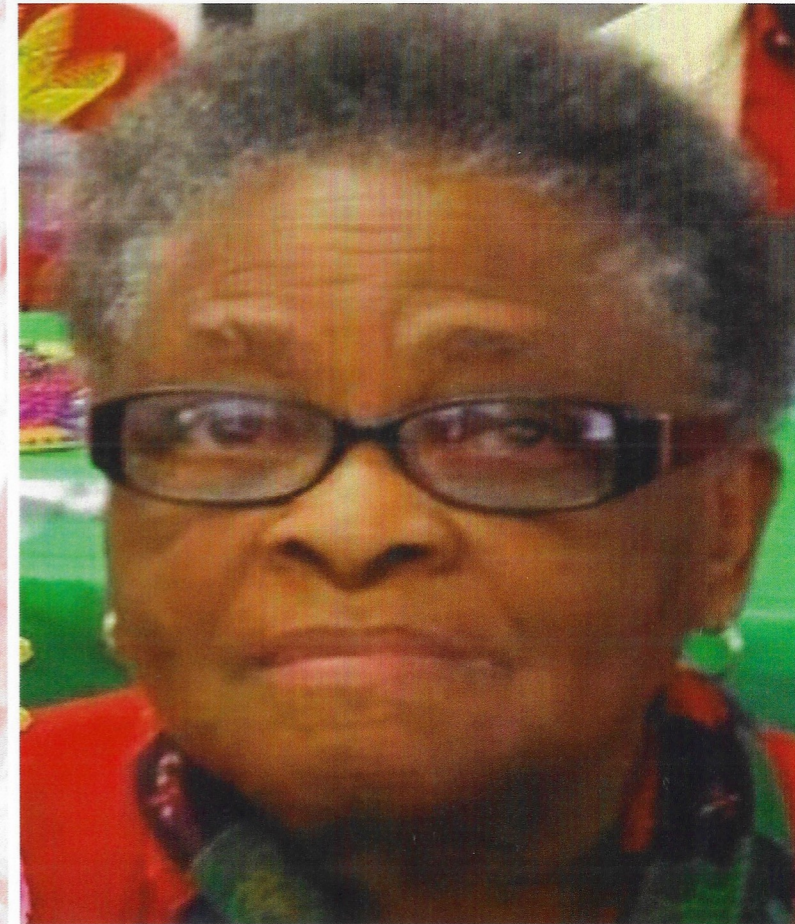

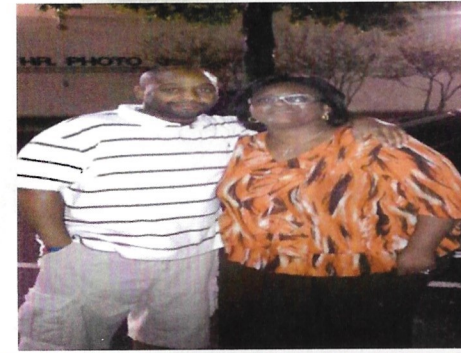

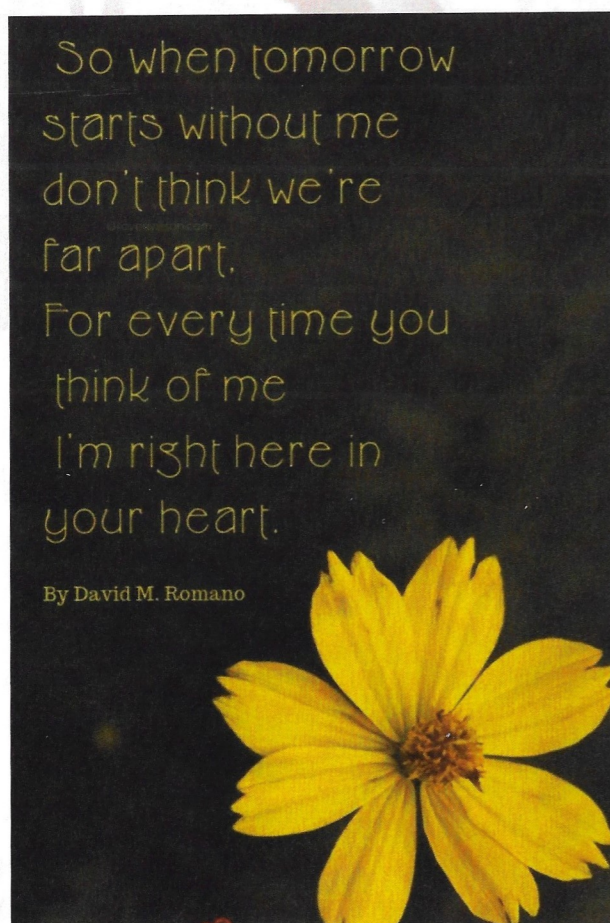


**Scripture Tribute**
