On October 23, 1937 in England, Arkansas, SB Bryles, lovingly called Sonny Boy, was born to Askew and Bessie Bryles. He was the youngest child of Bessie and the oldest child of Askew. Sonny was raised in the church, loved the Lord, and was baptized at an early age. He grew up in Ruston, Louisiana, where he loved to play football and baseball with the neighborhood children. Sonny attended Washington Elementary in Louisiana and shortly thereafter, the family moved to Pine Bluff, Arkansas where he attended Merrill High School.

Sonny Boy enlisted and began serving in the U.S. Navy in January 1956. It was at this time he adopted the name Samuel Brown Bryles. Samuel enjoyed his time in the service traveling to various countries while operating as a machinist. In 1959, after leaving the Navy, he moved to Los Angeles, California with childhood friend Curlee Burris. It was in Los Angeles that he met Mattie Lee Naylor. On March 3, 1963, less than a year after meeting, Mattie and Sam were married. Their marriage lasted 37 years until Mattie was called to her heavenly home.

As a young adult Sam enjoyed entertaining at his home. He loved to play card games and dominoes. He also enjoyed hanging out at King's Park in Long Beach and playing cards with his long-time friends, Harvey, Doc and Leon. He worked various jobs before finding his footing as a Maintenance Technician at ARA Services. He remained there for over 30 years before taking a job with the Long Beach Naval Shipyard, where he worked until he retired.

Sam had three biological children, Duane, Kevin and Cheryl, but he served as a father figure to many. He was often overheard calling the kids "Ugmo", which he considered a term of endearment. You would think this would push people away, but the neighborhood kids loved him and were always at his house.

On Monday, June 7, 2021, Sonny Boy was called home to be with the Lord. He was preceded in death by his wife Mattie, parents Askew and Bessie, son Kevin Bryles Sr., grandson Kaesaun Bryles, brother, Richard McCready Sr., sisters Gloria Jean Brewster and Lois Anne Bryles. 

















