On October 1, 1933, a baby girl was born in New Orleans to the parentage of Alexander Preston, Sr., and Alma Brignac Lagarde. They named her OLIVIA.

Olivia Preston was reared on the Clotilda Plantation located near Mathews, Louisiana and later made her home in Raceland, Louisiana. She worked as a Certified Nursing Assistant for St. Anne General Hospital, now Ochsner St. Anne Hospital, as a porter for the Community Bank of Lafourche, both in Raceland, and later worked until her retirement as a door greeter for Walmart in Mathews. She also served her community as a volunteer and worked in the Foster Grandparent Program for the Lafourche Parish School System.

Olivia accepted Christ at an early age and was baptized by the late Reverend Murray James Alcorn in 1948 at the New Fountain Baptist Church in Lockport, Louisiana. She later united with the New St. Matthews Missionary Baptist Church of Mathews under the leadership of Reverend Roland Bradley, Sr., where she served faithfully as a Deaconess, until her health dictated a need for convalescent care. She enjoyed singing praises to her Almighty God, cooking, and sewing.

"Mother Dear," as she was known, was the example of the Virtuous Woman described in Proverbs 31. She does her family good and not evil all the days of her life. She extends her hand to the poor. She reaches out her hands to the needy. Strength and honor are her clothing. She shall rejoice in time to come. She opens her mouth with wisdom, and on her tongue is the law of kindness. Charm is deceitful and beauty is passing, but a woman who fears the Lord, she shall be praised. Give her of the fruit of her hands, and let her own works bring her praise at the gates.

In the eighty-sixth season of her life, at 3:40 PM, on June 14th in the year of our Lord 2020, the Lord called her name. He said, "Come unto me, Olivia, and rest!"
