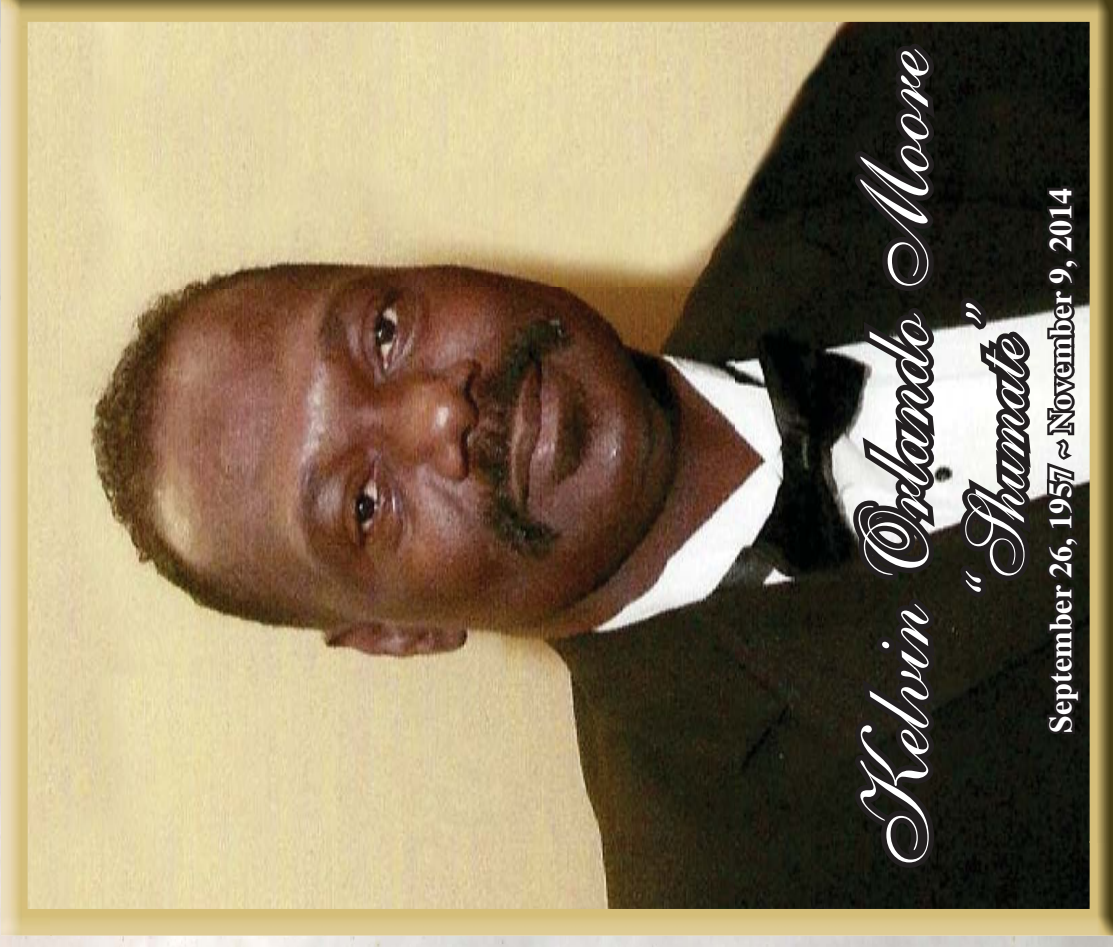

## Journey

Kelvin Orlando Moore "Shumate" was born September 26, 1957 in Leroy, Alabama. The son of Frank and Janice Mohamed, Kelvin was the eldest of four children. Kelvin grew up alongside of his uncle Randall Moore. They were just like brothers. This was a lifelong bond. Kelvin departed this life on Sunday, November 9, 2014 at 12:43pm.

Kelvin attended Prestwick High School and graduated from Leroy High School in 1975. During his high school years, Kelvin participated on the basketball and baseball teams. His achievements included holding the most number of points scored in one basketball game.

Kelvin was recruited to play baseball at Jackson State University (JSU) in 1975. Kelvin was a first baseman at JSU from 1975-1978. In 1977 & 1978 he was all conference and earned All-Conference Honors, USA Team Collegiate All American Honor and lettered in JSU Baseball. He contributed to the JSU 1977-78 SWAC Conference Championship Team. He was the first JSU player drafted by the MLB in 1978 to the Oakland Athletics. Kelvin was proud to have been inducted into the JSU Sports Hall of Fame in 2004.

His outstanding baseball performance in college led Kelvin to be recruited to play professional baseball. From 1978-1985, he played with the following teams: Tacoma Tigers where he was voted the most popular and named all time Tacoma Tiger First baseman; Jersey AA; Modesto California Class A; Waterbury Connecticut AA; Ogden, Utah AAA; Milwaukee Brewers, Vancouver AAA, Tidewater Tide, AAA Mets and the Chicago White Sox AAA. In 1981, he played in the Oakland Athletics Championship Series. On February 27 2010, Leroy High School retired Kelvin's Jersey #25.

Kelvin loved the game of baseball and taught everybody the game, including his son, Justin.

Kelvin accepted the Lord Jesus Christ at an early age and loved the Lord. Kelvin served as Deacon at Star Bethlehem Baptist Church in Greenville, Mississippi.

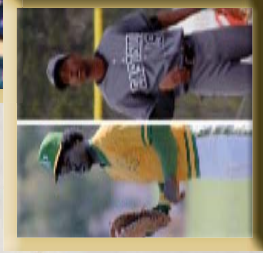
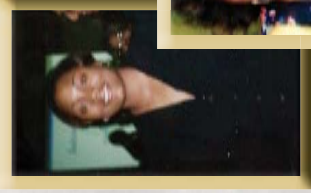
