Leonard P. "Pee Wee" Royer, the son of Glenn Earl Royer and Viola Marie "Dot" (Pritts) Royer, was born January 5, 1930 in Daykin, NE and passed away on January 12, 2022 at the age of 92 years, 7 days.

Leonard was a member of the Belleville Lions' Club; a member/volunteer for the Belleville Fire Department for 40 years, the Belleville Eagle's, Belleville Elk's Club, and a volunteer at the Republic County Historical Society Museum. He was active in the Chamber of Commerce for many years. He loved the group gambling trips, and working on Tim's farm.

Leonard was preceded in death by his parents; daughter, Tonya Marie in 1973; his wife, Betty Royer in 2011, and brother, Robert Dean Royer.

He is survived by one son, Tim Royer of Belleville, Kansas; many nieces and nephews, other relatives, and many friends.
