is now my full Reward.



Vernell attended the St. Louis Public Schools at Langston Elementary and Beaumont High School where he completed his studies in 1980.


Vernell participated in several skill building workshops/training programs where he became certified as a Laser Power Coat Painter for Powell's Transformer and Cupple's Mfg in Union

Vernell (aka Juno) never met a stranger.


