For He only takes the **BEST.**

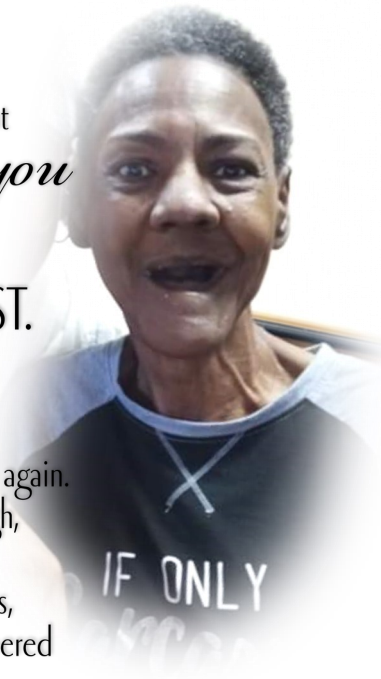
He knew that you were weary,
