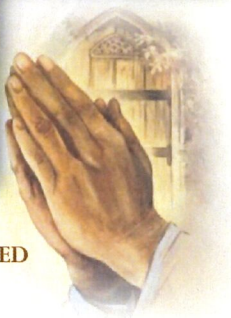


Acknowledgement
