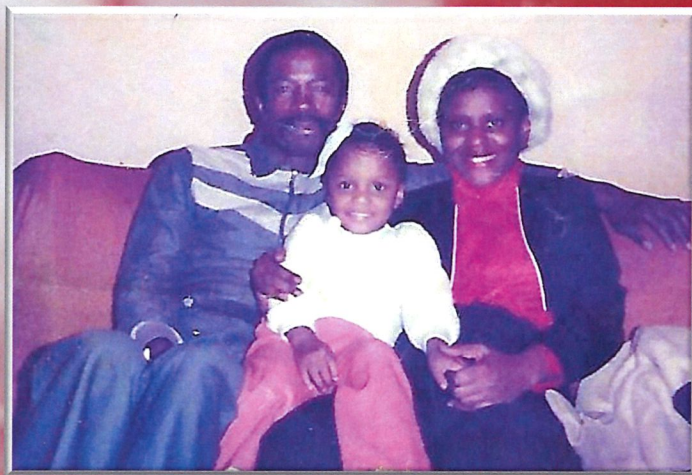
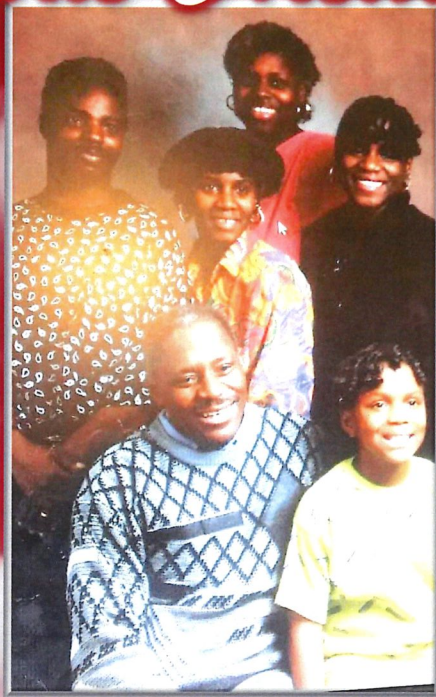


Precious Memories
