She also had four bonus siblings: Mark Green, Antonio Green, Monte Green, and Noel Turner. She is survived by her three daughters, Ronnesha Turner, Brittany Sutherland (Orelando Collier), and Daria Turner as well as three spiritual daughters, Shelisse, Cherrilleye, and Gabrielle. MINISTRY

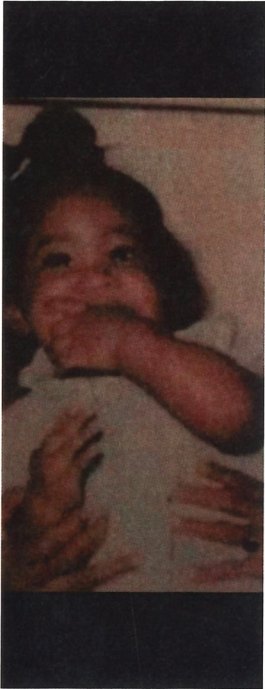
