It's all a part of the Maker's plan,


A step on the road to HOME.

Jameria Jean Lowery-Thomas was born on March 23, 1946, to the union of Jesse Thomas and Geraldine Elliott in Saint Louis, Missouri.

**Tameria** attended Lincoln Senior High School in East Saint Louis, Illinois, where she graduated in 1963 as the class valedictorian. She remained in East Saint Louis until 1976 before relocating to Saint Louis.
