Life Journey of Diana Marie Lewis

IANA MARIE HUGHES LEWIS was born November 17, 1958, in St. Louis, Missouri. She was the eldest of five children born to Henry Forest Hughes, Sr., and Dorothy Mae Hughes. Her sister, Stephanie Denise Hughes, preceded her in death.

She attended several elementary schools in various states due to her father being an active member in the military. The family relocated often. After moving back to St. Louis, *Diana* attended and graduated from Central High School. She later enrolled in Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan and graduated in 1982.

Diana was baptized in Jesus' name and filled with the Holy Ghost at Lively Stone Church of God under the leadership of the late Bishop P.L. Scott. She relocated to Los Angeles, California where she attended Apostolic Faith Home Assembly Church under the leadership of Elder G. With a heart for women affected by domestic violence, *Diana* was instrumental in forming "Women of Grace," an organization that fell under the umbrella of GIA (God is Able) Community Development Corporation. She consistently volunteered her services by attending workshops, creating support groups and helping women who came through the program.

Her most recent roles in the church under the leadership of Bishop Lee Scott, was being appointed to the Pastoral Cabinet as well as the Intercessory Prayer Team. She was dedicated and faithfully served these positions until her health failed.

Diana was loved by many. Her co-workers of over 25 years at Travelers Insurance Company experienced her outgoing personality, her kind spirit, and her willingness to be a true team player.

On Saturday July 24, 2021, at 5:30 a.m., *Diana* gracefully made her transition from earth to glory.
