



Ms. Beatrice "Bea" Praylow was born February 23, 1949 to the late Charlie Praylow and Millie W. Little in Bishopville, SC. She received her formal education through the Lee County Public School System where she graduated from Dennis High School (Class of 1967).

"Bea" began a very fruitful career of service in 1974 with the Bishopville Police Department as a dispatcher. A faithful and dedicated servant, Bea, continued to work hard and was promoted to Dispatch Supervisor, then Clerk for the Honorable Former Judge "Bill" Baskins for Municipal Court. After leaving the Police Department, "Bea", worked for the Lee County Child Support Office and Wateree Community Action as an Intake Counselor for the Job Training Readiness Intake Program. For six years, she was able to impact many lives while assisting with gaining employment throughout the community. From there, she was hired by the Honorable Sheriff Odell Corbett (2000) with the Lee County Sheriff's Office where she served as the Receptionist and Data Entry Clerk for the Civil Process.
