Chris was a truck driver most of his life. He easily made friends where ever he travelled.

Chris enjoyed outdoor activities like quadding and skidooring. He liked to go exploring alone or spend lots of time going out on the trails with family and friends. Chris loved to be on the road. He was first to volunteer to drive a trip whether it be local or out of province to bring family and friends to Wanless for a visit. He would always plan trips to go visit his family and friends.

Chris had a sense of humor that would always get people laughing. He had a competition going with his brother, Mike, about their trucks. Their conversation usually ended with Chris saying, "Ya, but RAM's can do that better!" Carol went on many trips with Chris where they would start singing along to the songs on the radio. Chris would shout out to Carol, "Stop singing, you're butchering the song" when she sang too loud. Every morning Carol would receive a call from Chris to discuss current events of politics and the soaps.

Chris enjoyed playing practical jokes. He would search the internet gag reels for ideas for his annual April Fool's joke with his nephew Austin. The boys enjoyed playing their play station games with their uncle. The three of them would end up accusing each other of cheating as they battled for top scores. Chris had a nickname for Braden, "Small Fry", where Braden's nickname for his uncle was "Small Fry."

Chris was so excited about the visit from his sister Christine and her daughter, Jodi, last summer. He shared with his friends how happy he was to hang out with her and the rest of the family. He called it a family reunion. Chris was looking forward to plans to travel to BC this summer to visit Christine and her family. Chris liked to Kareoke. Everyone enjoyed when he sang his favorite song, "The Gambler" because Kenny Rogers, as they would say, sang along with him.

Carol would make hospital visits to Chris. Similar to the scene from Big Bang Theory, Chris would request her to sing, "Soft kitty, warm kitty, little ball of fur. Happy kitty, sleepy kitty, purr, purr, purr." She would make a mistake and he would tell her, "You are butchering the song." He would sing it himself, with much shared laughter. He will be missed by all his family and friends.
