Flora Jane Crane went to be with the Lord, on Tuesday, September 8, 2020 at the age of 93 years. She passed away peacefully with her loving family beside her.

Flora was born to Simon Pelly and Katie Budd on July 11, 1927 in Saskatchewan. Flora worked at St. Paul's Care Home as a Health Care Aide in the 60's and 70's. Flora completed her license as a lay reader with Henry Budd College for Ministry in the early 90's. She was also an active ACW member.

Flora and her husband Malcolm lived a traditional life; they loved hunting and living off the land and they enjoyed spending time on their own trap line. Flora was a very talented entrepreneur, her handmade and beaded gauntlets, vests and mukluks were works of art. This traditional work was time-consuming, intricate and you had to have a strong eye for detail. She also made fur hats made from beaver, fox, muskrat and wolf. Flora often took first place at local Arts and Crafts shows in the North for her talents.

Flora met her husband Malcolm Crane in the early 40's in Cumberland House, Saskatchewan. They married December 2, 1947 and went on to have 13 children; Nicholas, Caroline, Henry, Ruth, Simon, Sam, Carl, Katherine, Abel, Esther, Daniel, Morris and Phyllis.

In addition to being a dedicated and loving mother, Flora also raised several of her grandchildren. She later adopted her daughter Sandie Storm. Throughout her entire life, she held an unwavering faith in God, which she shared with those who surrounded her. Many of her grandchildren will miss sitting with her listening to her stories in Cree, and we know many of them did not understand, but we listened anyway, she loved all her grandchildren equally.

Flora was predeceased and was met in heaven by her parents Simon and Katie; husband Malcolm; sons Simon, Samuel, Daniel, Nicholas; sisters Priscilla, Augusta, Christiana; brothers Miles, Albert; grandsons Philip, Dino and Kordic Constant; and granddaughter Larissa Crane.

Flora is survived by her children Caroline, Henry (Betsy), Ruth (Ken), Carl (Cathy), Katherine (Jack), Abel (Doris), Esther (Michael), Morris, Phyllis, Sandie Storm Vicky; grandchildren Kimberly, Hank, Kristen (Cody), Silas, Rhonda, Ramona, Theresa, Cynthia (Bernell), Big Sam, Bernard (Karen), Susan, Roland, Samuel (Michelle), Jillian, Nick, Lauren, Chris, Maria and Carl Crane.
