Laugh at all the things we used to do*

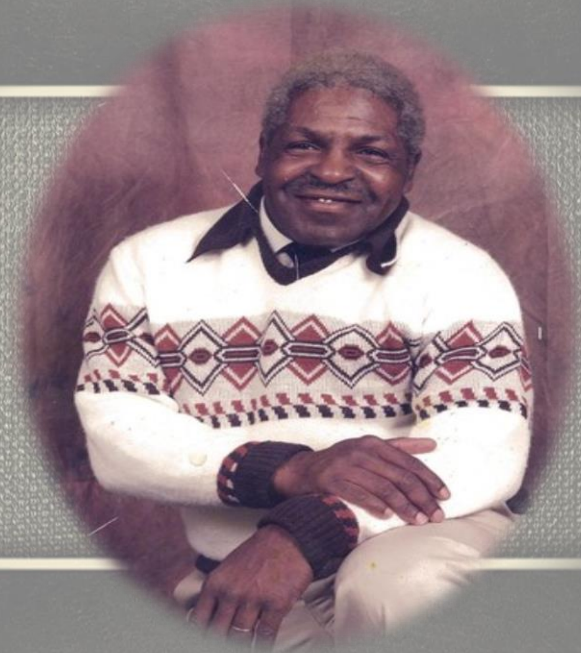
