### ***AWLA - Southern Arizona Chapter Monthly Luncheon RSVP Policy***

In the past, at our monthly luncheons, we have made every effort to accommodate members who have not made a reservation by the deadline. The number of members attending monthly luncheons without having made a reservation, however, has made it impossible for us to plan seating and food service in a manner such that the luncheons are informative and enjoyable for all of our members. As a result, the AWLA Southern Arizona Chapter has adopted the policy set forth below:

1. The cost for luncheons is \$15.00 for members, \$20.00 for non-members and \$8.00 for law students. Payment must be made at the door. The cost is due whether the individual attending chooses to eat lunch or not.
2. Reservations and cancellations must be made by 5:00 p.m. the Tuesday immediately prior to the luncheon.
3. Reservations are transferable. If you have made a timely reservation, another individual may attend in your stead without prior notice to AWLA.
4. Individuals with reservations who do not attend the luncheon, or who cancel after the reservation deadline will be billed the applicable cost. Individuals who do not arrive at the luncheon by 12:10 p.m. will be assumed to be no-shows and will not be admitted if their seat has been allocated to a standby attendee.
5. Individuals without reservations will be admitted on a standby basis only after it is determined that there is sufficient seating as a result of no-shows. If at 12:10 p.m. there are seats available as a result of no-shows, individuals without reservations will be admitted on a first-come, first-serve basis. If there are insufficient seats available as a result of no-shows, individuals without a reservation will not be admitted. The cost to attend the monthly luncheon without a reservation will be \$20.00 for members, \$25.00 for non-members and \$15.00 for law students, which must be paid at the door.

## BOARD OF GOVERNORS MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

October 2007

The State Bar of Arizona Board of Governors held a regular meeting on October 26, 2007.

**President's Report**—Dan McAuliffe reported that on October 9, 2007, he wrote to the editor of the *Arizona Republic*. The letter, which Dan had previously shared with the Board, expressed “the concern of this organization with recent attacks on Judges of the Maricopa County Superior Court and the manner in which they have been conducted.” The President of the Arizona Trial Lawyers Association has since asked us to join in a resolution “supporting (consistent with Ethics Rule 8.2(a)) the principle that lawyers should not attack the integrity of the justice system by means of reckless or false statements.” The Board voted not to sign onto the resolution, due to language in the proposal that might interfere with the Bar’s ongoing disciplinary investigation of specific individuals but indicated support for the main thrust of the resolution regarding integrity of the justice system.

**Executive Director's Report**— Teresa Schmid introduced I. Godwin Otu, the Bar’s new Diversity Director.

**Appointments Committee**—The Board of Governors, after considering the recommendations of the Appointments Committee, voted to appoint James J. Haas, the Maricopa County Public Defender, and Victoria E. Washington, a Deputy Public Defender, to the Community Legal Services Board of Directors.

**Senior Lawyers**—Nearly two hours were devoted to discussion of proposals that would affect the status of dues and CLE for senior lawyers, the creation of a Senior Lawyers Division, and the addition of an “emeritus” membership status. Frank Lewis, spokesperson for the Senior Lawyers Group, addressed the Board along with several other seniors to express their opinions. The proposals will be voted on at the November meeting.

### **Financial Report**—

**Tucson Building** - Larry McVey, Chief Financial Officer, updated the Board on the progress toward purchase of a building for the Southern Regional Office. The time for due diligence and completion of the contract has been extended. There are two remaining items of concern involved in due diligence: title issues pertaining to ownership of a sliver of property encroaching the driveway and review and approval of the interior design of the building. Mr. McVey anticipates these items will be resolved and that the purchase will close in December, with a three-month construction period to follow.

**Budget** - Mr. McVey reported a year-to-date surplus of \$637,000. The Bar has determined to develop and enhance its inventory of products for its members and is working to do so.

**Rules Committee News**—The Rules Committee presented a number of proposed rules and changes, and the Board took the following actions:

- The Board considered the proposed Criminal Law Jury Instructions submitted by the Criminal Jury Instructions Committee, and will vote upon them November 30th.
- The Board voted to send to the Supreme Court a petition to amend Supreme Court Rule 33.1 on Uniform Interrogatories.
- The Board voted to send to the Supreme Court a petition proposed by the Appellate Practice Section to limit the length of petitions for review and amicus briefs by word count, rather than page count.

- The Board voted to file with the Supreme Court a comment in support of the proposed Rules of Procedure for cases under the Legal Arizona Workers Act (colloquially referred to as the “Employer Sanctions Law”) as submitted in the petition filed by the Administrative Office of the Courts.
- The Board voted to file with the Supreme Court a comment on Juvenile Probation Hearing Rules (sua sponte).

### MAP Celebrates 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary

- The Member Assistance Program (MAP) celebrated its 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Harriet Turney—one of the founders of the program—and Hal Nevitt, Director of MAP, introduced six attorneys who gave testimonials as to how MAP assisted them as individuals.

### Other News

- Peter Collins, Jr. gave an account of the success of the College of Trial Advocacy, which is modeled after the national NITA program. The college needs students for its July 29-August 2, 2008 program, and Mr. Collins encouraged the Board to spread the word about it.
- The Chief Justice is gathering information on the impact of making eFiling of pleadings mandatory for members of the Bar in Superior Court in Maricopa County. Prior to signing such an order, she wants feedback from the Bar membership on this issue. The Board of Governors recommended sending the request to the Civil and Criminal Practice and Procedure Committees for feedback, and it will be discussed at the December Board meeting.
- C. Brad Vynalek notified the Board that ABA Day in Washington would be held on April 15-17, 2008.
- Joe Mikitish reported that the Committee on Persons With Disabilities in the Legal Profession sponsored a nationwide job fair directed to those with disabilities. It was held in Washington, D.C. Their *Great Speakers & Connections Series* will kick off on November 8<sup>th</sup>, with Justice Michael D. Ryan as the keynote speaker.
- Diane Meyers presented the Indigent Defense Task Force report. The Supreme Court modified Rule 6.8 to make compliance with ABA guidelines mandatory. The number of pending capital cases in Maricopa County eclipses those in the rest of the state, and defense organizations are working to address this. The Task Force will study the question of allocation of resources.
- The Board heard four recommended changes to the Bylaws that will be voted upon in November. They would: 1) change the Bar’s address from the old Monroe Street address to 24<sup>th</sup> Street; 2) stipulate that Secretary/Treasurer shall serve as the Vice Chair of both the Finance and Audit Committees; 3) allow some flexibility as to the time and place of the last regular meeting of the Board of Governors; and 4) require a minimum of nine regular meetings of the Board of Governors annually.
- The Board voted to support enacting S. 186 and H.R. 3013, both known as the “Attorney-Client Privilege Protection Act of 2007,” by authorizing President McAuliffe to execute a resolution from the Board to be sent to the ABA; letters of support also would be sent to representatives of the House and Senate.
