



DID YOU KNOW?

C7 Transmission Shudder

A couple VVCC members driving a 2016 C7 have experienced transmission shudder problems that lasted approximately 15-20 seconds then went away only to reappear several miles later. After some research on the Corvette Forum it was discovered others had the same problem not with just Corvettes but other models as well. On the forum, many solutions were presented along with many reasons for the transmission shudder.

During a test drive at 50 MPH, the transmission shudder occurred in 'V4' mode and at a constant speed. The dealer removed the transmission pan, drained and flushed the transmission system several times including lines and cooler (reference GM Document #4526930). The fluid was replaced with a different viscosity fluid. This appears to remedy the problem. If you are experiencing the same, I suggest that you contact an authorized GM dealer and report your transmission shudder. Chevrolet is aware of the problem and will do the right thing to address the shudder.
