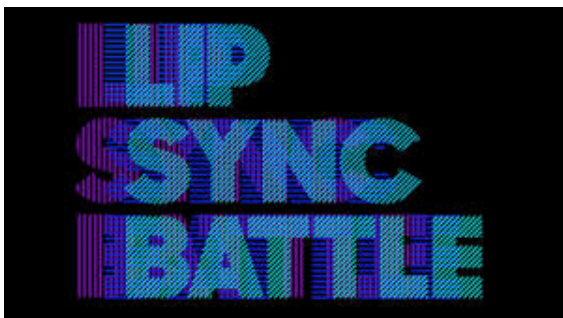

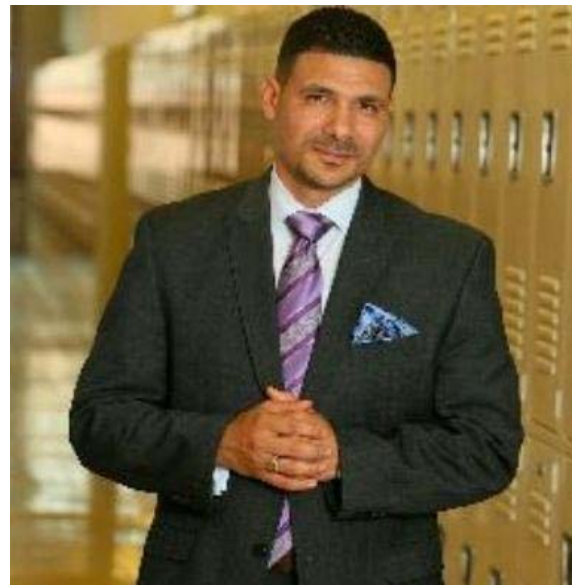
I Can't Wait to See You!

Earlier this month, for the second year in a row, EOA members involved in Chicago area TRIO programs and the Council for Opportunity in Education (COE) held two exciting events to celebrate 50 years of success in creating paths to upward mobility for low-income, first-generation students and their families. The first, an alumni reception hosted by Northeastern Illinois University's Center for College Access and Success, drew over 100 TRIO alums. The reception paid tribute to legendary TRIO director, Silas Purnell of Ada S. McKinley Community Services, who placed tens of thousands of low-income, minority students in college. A STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) Celebration was also hosted by Northeastern at its main campus. It engaged over 400 Chicago public and charter secondary students in hands-on activities. COE and Chicago TRIO directors are committed to making sure that both celebrations take place annually. 1. Iowa Congressman David Young is inviting high school students from throughout the 16 counties of Iowa's 3rd Congressional District to attend the annual Youth Leadership Summit on November 9th at the State Capitol Building in Des Moines.

Dr. Micky Johnson, the Director of the University of Northern Iowa's Classic Upward Bound Program and Chair of EOA's Association Planning and Development Committee, and Iowa TRIO President, **Ellie Burns**, will work directly with each participant to develop their leadership skill set – that assist students as they determine, develop and achieve their personal goals in high school and beyond. Johnson is highly regarded around Iowa and the nation for his work with countless students enriching their growth in high school as they prepare for the academic and personal rigors of college.

The one-day summit filled with networking and leadership training events is nonpartisan, free and open to all high school aged students who live in Iowa's 3rd Congressional District, **but preregistration is required.**
