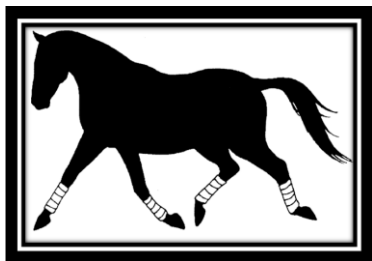

## **COVID 19 RESTRICTIONS & PROTOCOLS WILL BE ENFORCED**

**\*\*PLEASE NOTE FOR SEPTEMBER - TEST 3 OF EACH LEVEL WILL BE SCORED THE DAY OF THE SHOW. Other tests and prizes will be sent to you immediately after the show\*\***

STRIDE shows will follow the USDF USEF and FHP protocols for running equestrian competitions with restrictions for Covid 19 mitigation. All State guidelines will also be followed. This includes but is not limited to the following:

### **REQUIRED:**

- **FACE MASKS** worn in all public areas including near arenas, secretary stand, food vendor, warm up arenas, stabling common areas, parking common areas, etc. This does not apply when mounted on a horse, driving your horse or in your personal vehicle or stable space. **LIMIT GROUPS** to 10 or less.
- **SOCIAL DISTANCING** of a minimum of 6 feet between all persons even when mounted.
- **NO SPECTATORS** allowed. Only bring those people necessary to compete and care for your horse (groom, coach) **Anyone on grounds must sign both FHP and STRIDE Release Forms**. Please send both with your entry. Extra copies will be available outside the Office. (Office will be generally closed)
- **ENTRY THROUGH RT. 475A Competitor's Entrance ONLY** – Health/Temperature screening upon entry.
- **PARK** at least 50 feet from another vehicle or building to maintain distancing.
- **FACILITY ENTRY SCREENING** (Temp/wellness) Anyone exhibiting symptoms such as fever, persistent cough, etc. will be asked to leave and join us for a show on another date.
- **ENTRIES MAY BE LIMITED** if over-subscribed priority will be given to members in order that complete entries were received. Be sure to **SIGN YOUR ENTRY FORM** and include releases for all persons attending.
- **NO INCOMPLETE OR LATE ENTRIES** will be accepted in order to reduce secretary contact.
- **SCORES OR AWARDS MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE DAY OF SHOW**. Tests may be scored, placed and mailed to you after the show with award vouchers. If you wish to receive a ribbon instead of a voucher, please notify the secretary on your entry form. Results will be posted on [www.stridedressage.org](http://www.stridedressage.org) . **EACH SEPTEMBER SHOW DATE IS A SEPARATE SHOW requiring separate entry and stabling forms/fees.**

- **COVID FEE:** a fee of \$10 has been added to the entry form to cover additional supplies purchased for Covid Mitigation.

**Compliance is needed in order to maintain the privilege of running shows. Anyone refusing to follow the guidelines above will be asked to leave the grounds and may be refused entry to future shows.**

- 5) Signed Florida Horse Park Release (included with Entry Form in this Omnibus).
- 6) Signed STRIDE Covid 19 Release (included with Entry Form in this Omnibus).

**LATE ENTRIES/OVERSUBSCRIBED:** At her discretion, the Show Secretary may accept late entries (will include a \$20 late entry fee): **Complete entries** will be accepted in the order received. **If oversubscribed**, priority will be given to STRIDE members. **PLEASE NOTE:**

- While our **SHOW YEAR** is Jan 1 - Dec 31, your **STRIDE MEMBERSHIP YEAR** is Sept 1 - Aug 31.
- **All horses on grounds** must have a fully executed entry form, pay office fee, pay grounds or stabling fee, and **must wear assigned show number** when in hand or being ridden on the show grounds.
- **All Riders and Drivers** must comply with **MANDATORY HEADGEAR RULE** (see **ATTIRE** below).
- **Stabling Opens at 2:00 p.m.** the day before the show. **ALL COVID RESTRICTIONS APPLY.**
- **No car, truck or trailer parking** in Stabling Area. Please move all vehicles to marked parking areas after unloading/loading. This is a safety rule enforced by the Florida Horse Park.

- STRIDE is a volunteer organization and depends on club members to help support its activities. Volunteers are rewarded with vouchers that can be used for entry fees, membership fees or any fee associated with a STRIDE event.
- Those seeking a YEAR-END AWARD MUST VOLUNTEER 4 HOURS during the season (more is always appreciated!) Time conflicts on show day can be accommodated. Contact Rachel before the show to arrange this.
- Typical **volunteer jobs** are show manager, scribe, scorer, test runner, timer, ring steward, set up or take down of arenas, trail course and cones, etc. Half day schedules and 2 hours shifts are available.
- **One day of volunteering earns one voucher, equivalent to \$20.** Vouchers may be earned and used to offset entry fees and activity fees or earned and gifted. Frequent volunteers are also recognized and rewarded at the year-end banquet. Thank you for spending your time to help us with these shows!

## **STRIDE SCHOOLING SHOW DIRECTIONS & INFORMATION**

THE FLORIDA HORSE PARK is located at: 11008 S Highway 475, Ocala, F L 34480 - (352) 307-6699

**NOTE: MAIN ENTRANCE off Rt. 475 will be CLOSED!**

**DIRECTIONS TO THE COMPETITORS ENTRANCE TO THE FLORIDA HORSE PARK:** From I-75: head East on 484. At the first traffic light, take a left onto [SW 16th Ave/475A](#) Drive 1.5 miles. Turning lanes will be on your right - that's the new entrance that comes in behind the covered arena/barns. Look for the Stride Parking Signs.

**SHOW OFFICE – the show office for 2020 will be in the block pavilion building northeast of the arenas. (with restroom) Access to the Office will be restricted.**

**RIDE & DRIVE TIMES/STABLING MAP:** Posted online at [www.stridedressage.org](http://www.stridedressage.org) forty-eight (48) hours prior to show time. Competitors are advised to recheck times upon arrival to the show, as last-minute changes to the schedule may be made. Updates also posted on the STRIDE Facebook Page.

**STALLS. Florida Horse Park: Fee \$45/night. ONE bag of shavings is supplied. Additional bedding will NOT be available the day of the show.** Stalls **MUST** be reserved in advance through Stride 12'x 12' stalls. Stalls do not need to be stripped when leaving. Please mark on entry form if you intend to arrive the day before the show. **STALLS AVAILABLE AFTER 2:00 p.m. on the day before the show. All COVID Restrictions apply at any time while on grounds.** Please move all vehicles to designated parking area after unloading or loading. Park >= 50 feet apart. **NO CAR, TRUCK OR TRAILER PARKING in Stabling Area.** This is a requirement of the Florida Horse Park. **DOGS must be leashed at all times.** Leash length not to exceed 6 feet. Dogs must be in hand, tied up or enclosed. Loose dogs will incur a \$50 donation to the Florida Horse Park!

## **STRIDE SPECIFIC COMPETITION RULES**

**STRIDE RULES** are followed first, then USEF / USDF / ADS / WDAA rules. This includes when riding New Versatility Dressage Tests as well. See tack and attire rules for Ridden Versatility Dressage below and specific Versatility Rules on Page 11.

**Show management reserves the right** to refuse any entry, use substitute judges, combine or split classes as entries warrant. Should a show become oversubscribed entries will be taken in the order received with further priority given to STRIDE members.

**IMPORTANT – ASTM/SEI approved PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR MANDATORY at all times on show grounds when mounted or driving (including Western Dressage, Versatility, Driving and Trails classes).** *“From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI(Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted.”*

### **ATTIRE**

- **RIDER: ASTM/SEI approved headgear required (see above) in all classes and all divisions.** Boots, breeches and collared shirt. Half chaps with paddock boots allowed. Coats and braiding optional. For Western Dressage, collared shirt, western boots, and trousers or jeans required. Chaps not required. No breeches without chaps in Western Dressage.
- **DRIVER: ASTM/SEI approved headgear required (see above) in all classes.** Informal or marathon, aprons optional. See ADS Rulebook at [http://www.americandrivingsociety.org/ADS\\_Rulebook.asp](http://www.americandrivingsociety.org/ADS_Rulebook.asp) . Presentation will not be scored.
- **HORSE:** Horses must display bridle number in hand, in harness or under saddle. Bell boots, martingales and leg wraps are not allowed when showing in Traditional Dressage or Versatility Dressage tests, but leg wraps are permitted for Western Dressage. Leg protection is allowed for all other versatility classes except Dressage Seat Equitation. **STRIDE follows USDF/USEF rules for warm-up equipment unless otherwise noted.**
- **RIDDEN VERSATILITY DRESSAGE will use the same rules as Traditional or Western Ridden Dressage. Attire and Tack should be correct for the style of tack being used.** Traditional Dressage riders should wear correct USEF/USDF Attire, Western Dressage Riders should wear correct WDAA Western Attire and tack. For example, bell boots, martingales and leg wraps are not allowed when showing in Traditional Dressage tack for Versatility Dressage tests, but leg wraps/boots are permitted for Western Dressage tack in Versatility Dressage Tests. In addition, leg protection is allowed for all other versatility classes except Dressage Seat Equitation

**UNAUTHORIZED ACCESS:** Please respect management requests to avoid closed areas not being used for STRIDE Shows. FHP is under construction for a number of improvements. Many areas are closed for your safety.

**CLASS PLACING AWARDS:** First place award and ribbons for first through sixth place. Instead of a ribbon, competitor may request a coupon that can be applied to future entries or other STRIDE activities. If not picked up at the show, Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be mailed to competitors after the end of the show, but unclaimed class ribbons will be returned to club inventory.

**SHOW DAY CHAMPIONSHIPS:** When there are at least 3 CCUs (equine + rider or driver) competing at a LEVEL+DIVISION, STRIDE will award **SHOW DAY CHAMPIONSHIPS** and **SHOW DAY RESERVE CHAMPIONSHIPS** to the CCUs with the highest and second highest scores at that LEVEL+DIVISION (*excluding Intro*). However, the CCU Champion may not be Reserve to himself/herself. In addition, the show's highest score in Traditional Dressage, Western Dressage, and Driven Dressage will be announced in newsletter. **Note: Introductory Level Dressage, Gaited Dressage, Eventing Dressage and Versatility classes are not included in or awarded daily championships, reserve championships or high points**

**CHECK SCORES BEFORE LEAVING SHOW GROUNDS.** Corrections gladly made in show office on show day. No corrections will be made after the end of the show.

**AN APPEALS COMMITTEE** will consist of the Senior Judge, Show Manager and a non-competing 3rd person. Any complaints or questions concerning possible rule infractions or health and safety issues must be brought to the attention of the Show Manager and/or a STRIDE officer. If the Show Manager cannot resolve the matter satisfactorily, the appeals committee will convene. Decisions of the appeals committee are final.

## **SHOW DIVISIONS**

### **RIDDEN DRESSAGE DIVISIONS (Includes traditional, western, eventing, gaited, etc.):**

- **OPEN RIDER DIVISION:** Open to all riders including those who accept remuneration for riding, driving, showing, training, schooling, or conducting clinics or seminars, giving riding or driving lessons, lessons in showmanship, instructions in equitation or horse training and so do not meet the requirements to be AA or Jr/YR. AA and Jr/YR riders may enter open divisions in order to qualify for year-end awards in a level they previously won a year-end championship. [Refer to sections 1307 and 1308 \(General Rules\) in the USEF rulebook](#). Riders may be reclassified as AA or Jr/YR after 12 months of NOT engaging in activities which classified them as Open competitors (see USEF reclassification of Amateur).
- **ADULT AMATEUR DIVISION (AA):** Riders over 21 who do NOT accept remuneration for riding, driving, showing, training, schooling, or conducting clinics or seminars, giving riding or driving lessons, lessons in showmanship, instructions in equitation or horse training. May enter classes designated AA or Open.
- **JUNIOR /YOUNG RIDER DIVISION (Jr/YR):** 21 years of age and under. May enter classes designated as AA, Jr/YR, or Open. Juniors (under 18 years old) may ride stallions in all Ridden Dressage classes EXCEPT Dressage Seat Equitation. Junior drivers 10 and under must be accompanied by an adult in the carriage.
- **NOVICE DIVISION: NOVICE RIDER (NR), NOVICE HORSE (NH).** Novice status applies to horses and riders who are in their first year of showing dressage. Novice status applies only to Walk /Trot Introductory classes (Classes 1 – 4).

### **DRIVEN DRESSAGE DIVISIONS:**

- **HORSE** (including mules)
- **PONY** (up to 14.2 hands)
- **VERY SMALL EQUINE** (VSE = 38" and under, as measured to the most distal hair in the mane)

### **VERSATILITY DIVISIONS:**

- **RIDDEN VERSATILITY:**
  - **WALK/TROT** – Open, Adult Amateur, Junior/Young Rider as in Ridden Dressage Above (No Novice Divisions)
  - **WALK/TROT/CANTER** - Open, Adult Amateur, Junior/Young Rider as in Ridden Dressage Above
- **DRIVEN VERSATILITY:**
  - **TRAINING LEVEL** – Horse, Pony and Very Small Equine as in Driven Dressage Divisions Above
  - **PRELIMINARY LEVEL** – Horse, Pony and Very Small Equine as in Driven Dressage Divisions Above

## **STRIDE'S SPECIAL JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDER AWARD:** **EMILY BUTLER JUNIOR/YOUNG RIDER PERPETUAL TROPHY** **SPONSORED BY JUDY DOWNER - Limited to Junior/Young Riders– NO DIVISIONS OR LEVELS.**

**Open only to Junior or Young Riders**, this award requires:

- 3 traditional dressage scores (Training Level and above)
- 3 different shows
- AND 3 Dressage Seat Equitation classes (Walk/Trot/Canter).

One award given to highest median score across divisions and levels. Winner will maintain the trophy for one year then return it to be awarded to the next winner.



## CLASSES/LEVELS

### RIDDEN DRESSAGE CLASSES

- **INTRODUCTORY LEVEL** is for horses and riders in their first year of showing dressage. Tests for Novice Intro division (classes 1-4) require showing at the walk and trot only, using current USDF Introductory Tests A and B. Tests for Open Intro Division (Classes 5-6-7) will use USDF Introductory Tests A, B, and C (C includes canter).

### DRIVEN DRESSAGE CLASSES

- **TRAINING LEVEL, PRELIMINARY LEVEL AND ABOVE** will use NEW 2020 [American Driving Society \(ADS\)](https://americandrivingsociety.org/Events-Resources/Resources/Dressage-Tests) tests

- Drivers wishing to drive tests other than those published by ADS must furnish 2 copies of that test with entry.
- All tests are conducted in 80mx40m arena.
- Juniors are permitted to drive, but an adult must ride in the carriage for juniors 10 and under. Both must wear helmets.

### WESTERN DRESSAGE CLASSES

- **INTRO, BASIC, LEVEL 1 AND ABOVE** will use WDAA tests <https://westerndressageassociation.org/wdaa-tests/>
- Western Dressage Competitors should carefully review the rules at <https://westerndressageassociation.org/western-dressage-rules-tests/>
- STRIDE will follow STRIDE Rules first, then current WDAA tests and rules with the following exception:  
**ASTM/SEI approved helmets are required for all riders**

**GAITED DRESSAGE** will be conducted as a “Test of Choice”. **No year-end award.**

- Horses may be shown in English or Western tack. Competitors may enter the class up to 3 times.
- **Competitors must provide two copies of the desired test(s) with their entry.**

**VERSATILITY CLASSES:** For Versatility choose your dressage test below to determine your Level. You will then choose 4 additional classes from the Additional Versatility Class List to complete your 5 required scores. Drivers may also enter a ridden class and riders may enter a driven class as one of their additional 4 classes for YEA purposes..

- **RIDDEN DRESSAGE CLASSES** – (1 base dressage score from one of the tests below (CLASS V1 or V2 ONLY) required for Year End Awards in ridden versatility divisions. – **SEE NEW VERSATILITY REQUIREMENTS for YEA page 10 for clarification**). Offered at all shows.
  - **VERSATILITY RIDDEN WALK/TROT** will use Versatility Dressage Test LEVEL 1 (Class V1 Working Eq Level 1 Intro)
  - **VERSATILITY RIDDEN WALK/TROT/CANTER** will use Versatility Dressage Test LEVEL 2 (Class V2 Working Eq Level 2 Novice A)
  - **English or Western TACK** may be used for Versatility Ridden Dressage Tests (Western, English, Baroque)
  - See <https://www.confederationwe.us/rules/> for Ridden Versatility tests. Rules will follow regular ridden dressage rules: Stride first, then USDF/USEF if English tack or WDAA/USEF if Western tack.

  - **VERSATILITY DRIVEN DRESSAGE TRAINING LEVEL** will use ADS Training Level Test C
  - **VERSATILITY DRIVEN DRESSAGE PRELIMINARY LEVEL** will use ADS Preliminary Level Test C.

**ADDITIONAL VERSATILITY CLASSES BELOW:** In addition to 1 Base Dressage Score and 3 additional scores from 3 different classes below are required for Year End Awards. **SEE NEW VERSATILITY REQUIREMENTS for YEA** page 9 – 11 for clarification. \*Note: for Year End awards enter the division that matches your dressage test division. For example: Novice Rider Versatility Ridden Dressage Walk/Trot would enter DBTL walk trot + DSE Walk/Trot, etc. **SEE COMPETITION OVERVIEW ON PAGE 2 FOR SCHEDULE OF VERSATILITY CLASSES OFFERED.**

- **VERSATILITY TRAIL (RIDDEN OR DRIVEN):** A ridden or driving class consisting of trail obstacles such as a bridge, gate, mailbox or ground poles. A score of 0 to 10 will be given for each obstacle where 0=not performed and 10=excellent. Obstacles are to be ridden in the order and in the gaits as indicated in the course map which will be posted 48 hours prior to the show on [www.stride.clubexpress.com](http://www.stride.clubexpress.com) or [www.stridedressage.org](http://www.stridedressage.org) An obstacle not performed will earn a 0. Specific instructions will be posted on the map and may be clarified with the judge prior to execution.
  - **NOTE:** CCUs will be evaluated and judged on how well they work as a team negotiating obstacles with rider demonstrating good horsemanship with effectiveness, strategy and finesse and horse responding to cues with obedience, relaxation, calmness, and willingness without disobedience, spooking and resistance. Control of the horse must be maintained at all times and that the judge has the right to ask a competitor to move on from an obstacle where he/she determines that safety is an issue with a 0 being given for that obstacle. Safety must be kept in mind at all times. The judge has the right to disqualify a CCU that he/she deems a safety risk to themselves, spectators, or trail crew. Disqualifications for safety concerns, off course without attempt at correction or withdrawals will result in no score and will not count toward YEA requirements.
- **DRESSAGE SEAT EQUITATION (RIDDEN WT or RIDDEN WTC);** Riders judged as a group. Judge may ask for individual tests. Judged on rider's position and effect of the aids. \* For YEA Enter the division that matches your dressage test division.
  - **The Walk/Trot/Canter Dressage Seat Equitation Class also counts toward the EMILY BUTLER Junior/Young Rider PERPETUAL TROPHY Sponsored by Judy Downer. See more details in SCORING YEAR END AWARDS on page 12**
- **REINSMANSHIP (Driven Only)** Drivers will execute a pattern in the driven dressage arena using cones to designate where movements are to be executed. CCUs will be judged according to requirements set forth in the test. The test used for Driven Versatility classes (Horse, Pony, VSE) will be Super Reinsmanship Test # 1 – American Driving Society and can be found at: [www.americandrivingsociety.org](http://www.americandrivingsociety.org)
- **DRESSAGE BY THE LETTERS (RIDDEN OR DRIVEN):** May be completed at Walk Trot or Walk Trot Canter. Any gait may be used EXCEPT FOR NOVICE RIDERS where canter will be cause for elimination. This is a speed class in which the horse and rider/driver must go from Dressage letter to Dressage letter marked with sets of cones, in alphabetical order. All the Dressage letters will be used including the centerline letters. Time begins when rider/driver enters the ring at A and time ends when rider/driver exits the ring at A. **NO CALLERS** are permitted. Five seconds will be added to the time for each cone knocked over. Missed gate(s) result in elimination. Fastest time wins. Gate widths are set at 180 cm. **Note for Year End Awards: enter the division that matches your dressage test division.** For example: Novice Rider + DBL walk trot; Open Intro (or above tests) + DBL walk, trot, canter.
- **PRIX CAPRILLI (RIDDEN ONLY):** A dressage test with two Ground Poles (Walk/Trot) or two X rails (W/T/C) Test 1 will be used for all divisions. (X Rails for W/T/C may show a few canter strides after the X Rail) <https://rogaterc.com/wp-content/uploads/2018/01/Prix-Caprilli-for-Rogate-RC-2018.pdf>
- **CONES (DRIVEN ONLY):** A driving course is set up with start and finish gates between which obstacle gates are set on course, at certain distances and angles from one another, to be driven in numerical order and in specified direction. Gates are set at specific widths and marked by cones topped with weighted balls. For every ball dislodged from its supporting cone, a 3 point penalty is charged. Five (5) additional penalty points will be added for each run-out or disobedience. **Time on course breaks all ties.** As a safety precaution, drivers are encouraged to maintain gaits well within their control margins. No cantering permitted on 40 cm classes; cantering optional for 30 cm classes, drivers having a clear understanding that cantering increases the risk of penalties accrued. ## **GENERAL ELIGIBILITY FOR STRIDE YEAR END CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS (YEAs)**

### Basic Requirements:

- the CCU must have shown in at least 3 STRIDE shows except for Drivers who must show in 2 STRIDE Shows this year..
- the CCU must have completed the minimum number and required level of tests at the same LEVEL+DIVISION
  - See Specific Eligibility Requirements Below for your Division and Level.
- the rider/driver or a previously designated substitute must have 4 recorded, verified VOLUNTEER hours at a STRIDE event during the season. Low and no contact positions available.

- See other general requirements below.

### **RIDER/DRIVER MUST BE A STRIDE MEMBER at the time of the show in which scores or points are earned.**

Membership begins September 1 of each year. If membership fee is paid at the show, be sure to fill out the membership application at that time. Without a complete membership form on file at the time the scores are earned, you are not considered a member. STRIDE needs a reliable record of member's contact information and liability signature.

**VOLUNTEER REQUIREMENT To be eligible for a YEA.** In addition to other requirements listed here, a STRIDE member **must volunteer** at a STRIDE show or event in 2020 for a **minimum of four hours**. Volunteers must sign in and out with the Volunteer Coordinator to record time and pickup vouchers. A qualified substitute person may be designated AT THE EVENT (not afterwards) and clearly marked in the documentation as a substitute for the STRIDE member.

**Rider/Driver/Horse Competition Combinations are considered unique Competition Combination Units (CCUs).** Scores earned by one CCU are not transferable to any other CCU. *Note: scores earned at any other venue are not eligible to be counted for STRIDE YEAs.*

**COMPETITION STATUS ELIGIBILITY FOR RIDDEN YEAs:** Eligibility is based on the rider's 2020 competition status: Novice Rider (NR), Adult Amateur (AA), Jr/YR, Open, and on the horse's status for Novice Horse (NH). Junior riders must retain their Jr status until December 31 of the year in which they turn 21 years of age. Although Adult Amateur and Jr/YR riders may compete in open classes and win open division Daily and Year End championships based on those scores, scores earned in open classes will not count in AA or Jr/YR calculations.

**PREVIOUS YEA WINNER ELIGIBILITY:** "Won" in this section = YEA championship only, not YEA reserve championship.

#### **Eligibility:**

- A CCU having won a ridden or driven level/division YEA championship in previous years is no longer eligible to win any YEA award in that level/division, BUT they may still compete at individual shows at that level/division and retain eligibility to win level/division daily championships at future Schooling Show Series shows.
- If a Ridden CCU has won the level/division YEA as a JR or AA, that CCU may still compete for the YEA OPEN championship award at the same level by entering and competing in the Open classes.
- If a Ridden CCU has won a YEA Open Championship at a level, that CCU is eligible to compete and win a YEA Award as a Jr/YR or AA at the same level after 12 full months of not engaging in activity which had classified them as a professional/Open competitor (See Amateur reclassification under USEF Rules).
- A ridden CCU may win two consecutive levels in one year for YEA Awards.
- A CCU cannot win more than one Versatility YEA Award in a given year. A rider or driver who has previously won a Year End Award in Versatility may compete and is eligible for subsequent Year End Awards in Versatility.

## **SPECIFIC ELIGIBILITY FOR YEAR END HIGH POINT AWARDS AT EACH DIVISION/LEVEL**

**High Point award requires the same number of shows and scores as YEA Championships and 4 hours volunteer time.**

- **Traditional Dressage:**
  - One award for the highest score recorded in each division (AA, Open, and Jr/YR) at each individual level for Introductory through FEI..
- **Western Dressage:**
  - One award for the highest score recorded in each division (AA, Open, and Jr/YR) at each individual level. Above levels.
- **Driven Dressage:**
  - One award for the highest score recorded in each division (Horse, Pony and Very Small Equine) at each individual level.



## **SPECIFIC ELIGIBILITY FOR STRIDE YEAR END CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS (YEA)**

### **PLEASE NOTE IF YOU RIDE MORE THAN THE REQUIRED NUMBER OF TESTS FOR YEA COMPUTATIONS:**

- **For Ridden Dressage**, include two scores from the top test in the level.
- **For Driven Dressage**, include scores from at least two different tests within the level
- **The Year End Scores For Ridden and Driven Dressage will be the median of all scores** (no longer the average or mean score)
- **For Versatility**, only the highest score in each class will count toward Year End Awards.

A copy of your current STRIDE membership card included with your entry will entitle you to **NFDA member rates**.

**Championship Classes** will be offered at each level in 3 divisions: Open, Adult Amateur, Junior and Intro and will be pinned Champion, Reserve Champion through sixth place. Cash awards to Champion and Reserve Champion.

Note: A portion of all qualifying fees at each Level/Division will held in a **Championship Fund** to be awarded as follows: Champion 60% and Reserve Champion 40% of funds accumulated at that Level/Division.

**A unique Rider/Horse combination is identified as an eligible Competition Combination Unit (CCU).** Eligibility to compete in Championship Classes requires an identified CCU to earn two scores on tests listed in next paragraph reflecting 60% or better from two different judges. Qualifying scores are not transferable to any other CCU.

**Qualifying classes** are made available to both STRIDE and NFDA members at both STRIDE and NFDA 2019 schooling shows and consist of Tests 3 of USEF 2019 Training, First, Second, Third, and Fourth Levels and USDF Test B at Intro Level. Check NFDA website for Western Dressage Qualifying information.

A **qualifying fee of \$5 per qualifying test** is payable with entry. See details on entry form.

**A RIDER/HORSE OR DRIVER/HORSE COMBINATION IS CONSIDERED A UNIQUE COMPETITION COMBINATION UNIT (CCU).** A separate entry form must be filled out for each CCU. A CCU may compete in no more than two 2 consecutive levels at any individual show.

### **SCRATCHES, REFUNDS & NO SHOWS:**

- Scratches before closing date are given a full refund (entries and stalls/grounds fees). No veterinary or medical notes are required.
- Refunds after closing date are only eligible to receive a refund (in the form of STRIDE voucher) for entry fees or grounds fee provided a veterinary or medical note is provided to the show manager. Stabling fee is not refunded. The competitor must notify the show manager by 6 pm the day before the show to receive a refund (voucher). Competitors not notifying the show manager prior to this time can only be considered for a refund (voucher) upon petition to the show manager and STRIDE Board.
- There is no guarantee of refund for “no shows,” with or without medical or veterinary note, but each petition will be reviewed on a “case by case” basis.

**CANCELLATIONS:** In case of impending severe weather or other uncontrollable event such as a hurricane, a committee consisting of the President, Vice President and Show Manager may cancel a show. Any cancellation due to weather will be posted on [www.stridedressage.org](http://www.stridedressage.org) and/or the STRIDE Facebook Page by 7 pm the night preceding the show. The show may be rescheduled at a later date, but not necessarily at the same venue. Competitors will be credited at the make up show for their ride/drive fees but **STALL FEES & GROUNDS FEES WILL NOT BE REFUNDED.**

# FLORIDA HORSE PARK (FHP) RULES FOR STRIDE SHOWS

## GENERAL SAFETY RULES

No smoking in offices, stable pavilions, spectator pavilions, equine buildings or arenas.

In accordance with State Regulations, no open fires are ever permitted on any part of the HORSE PARK property. Barbeque grills may be used in designated areas only.

Trash must be placed in proper receptacles.

HORSE PARK staff, in cooperation with STRIDE MANAGEMENT, may remove dangerous, disruptive or unlawful persons from the HORSE PARK.

Every competitor must leave the grounds not more than 90 minutes after the conclusion of the show (i.e., last class ends) unless special arrangements have been made with the STRIDE Show Secretary. Additional stabling nights are available for an additional stall fee of \$35.

## PARKING AND TRAFFIC

When parking and unloading, all participants and guests must follow posted signs and/or instructions from a STRIDE representative.

**No vehicles are permitted to park within 30 feet of any stabling facility unless unloading or loading. NO TRAILERS may be parked in the stabling area except for loading or unloading.**

All motorized vehicles, including but not limited to cars, trucks, golf carts, motorcycles, mopeds, ATV's etc. shall be operated by a licensed driver.

## HORSES AND DOGS

All animals brought to the Florida Horse Park must observe all regulations of the State of Florida Animal Health Division.

**Every horse must at all times (whether under saddle or being led) wear the STRIDE competition number. Non-competing horses must be registered with the STRIDE Show Secretary.**

Longeing and long-lining is permitted only in designated areas (check with Show Manager) and as long as the horse is under control and if the activity does not interfere with other horses/riders as determined by STRIDE management.

**All dogs must be on a leash at all times. There is a \$50 fee payable to the Florida Horse Park for any loose dogs collected by a Florida Horse Park or STRIDE representative.**

## STABLING

**Only one horse per stall.**

Stall fee **DOES NOT INCLUDE BEDDING**; additional bedding is for sale from the Florida Horse Park for \$9 per bag, payable to the Show Secretary, who will have a bag brought to you. FHP requests that additional bedding is bought from the park.

STRIDE provides on-site overnight security for stabled horses.

If, when you arrive, there are loose shavings of any kind in the stall you have been assigned, notify the show secretary or show manager before putting your horse in the stall. Stall cleaning at end of show is included in stall fee.

All manure must be disposed of in designated areas only. Only bedding and manure is to be placed in manure bins.

**In case of dispute, the STRIDE Show Manager's decision is final.**
