## Jeff Allan McGuire

May 21, 1956-January 12, 2008

Born May 21, 1956 to James and Janice McGuire, Jeff grew up in Beavercreek, Ohio as the oldest of three children and grew up on the family farm. Always interested in how things are put together, he gravitated to electronics, and earned a degree in electrical engineering from the ITT Technical Institute. After a short time living in Chicago, he ended up in San Antonio in 1979. He had a long career in electronics and communications. In recent years he became a builder, completing several houses.

In San Antonio, Jeff developed intersecting circles of friends that endure to this day. While he was an avid scuba diver, the Texas Ski Council will remember him most for his passion for skiing. He was a core member and past president of Los Amigos Ski Club, and a fixture on many ski trips. As a Vice President on the Texas Ski Council, one of his last acts was to finalize arrangements for the TSC Winter Shootout trip to Telluride for 400+ skiers.

Jeff also committed a great deal of his time and was a longstanding board member of South Texas Charities. He helped arrange many fundraisers for the charity. His interests went well beyond skiing, scuba diving and his charity commitments, however, as he enjoyed golf, tennis, racquetball, soccer, travel, sailing, flying, waterskiing, barbecuing, but most of all being with his friends. A man of few words, he nonetheless was the natural leader and problem-solver wherever he went. In his quiet, observant and



thoughtful way he constantly took care of things behind the scenes, never drawing attention to his actions

Jeff will truly be missed by not only his friends, but his daughter, Jennifer Lynn, two granddaughters, parents, brother and sister. His friends will miss him for his generous free spirit; happy, positive, larger than life eternal optimism, and always being the first to offer a helping hand. You just had to call out his name, and he came running.
