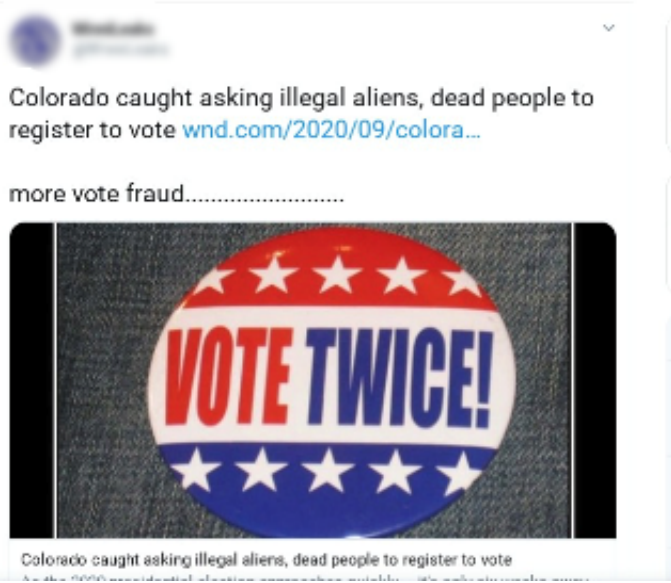

Voter Registration Cards



We recently received a SQUINT alleging that Colorado was asking illegal aliens and dead people to vote:



Here is a recent interview with Colorado’s Secretary of State addressing the voter registration postcards (<https://denver.cbslocal.com/2020/09/27/colorado-secretary-state-explains-voter-registration-postcards/>). A summary of the interview is that Colorado sends the postcards to as many potential voters as possible. Included in the postcards are the criteria for voters in Colorado which includes (1) 18 years old by election day, (2) a United States citizen, and (3) a Colorado resident for at least 22 days before the next election.

It is hard to make a recommendation here as the Colorado postcards clearly had the Colorado’s criteria for voting and yet they were used to allege fraud. However, actively correcting the record with interviews such as the one referenced above by the Colorado Secretary of State help correct misinformation.

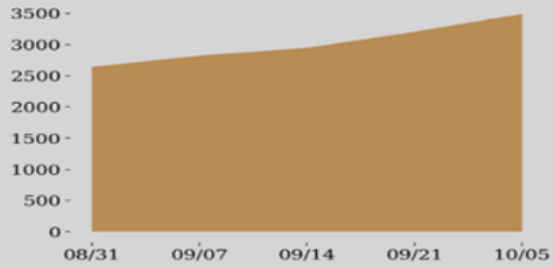

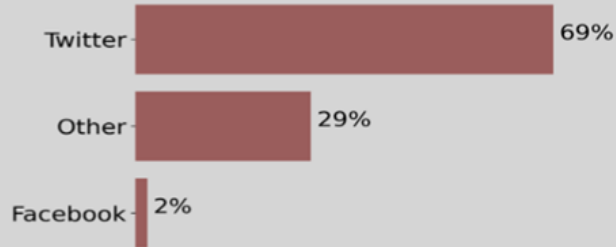
