EXHIBITOR RULES & CATEGORIES

Flower show entries
and exhibitor registration
Friday May 1st 3:30pm to 6:30pm

The flower show is being judged by
accredited horticulture judges,
using CVGC Rules.

General Rules & Categories

Entry is open to the public. Exhibitors do not
need to be members.

Registration time is 3:30 pm to 6:30 pm. Late
entries will not be accepted. There is no limit to
the number of entries. **An exhibitor may have
only two entries in each class or subclass, but
may enter as many classes as desired.**

Cut flowers must have been grown by the ex-
hibitor. All flowers and plants must be clean and
bug free. Remove all dead leaves and petals. If
there are any bugs on flowers or plants the ex-
hibit will be removed from the show. Container

plants must have been in entrant's possession
for at least 6 months. **All the specimens must
be identified by botanical and/or common
name on the entry card.** Commercially grown
flowers/plants are allowed only in the Artistic
Arrangement Section.

**All exhibitors will be required to sign that
they have read the rules.**

Ribbons ~ A first, second, third, and honorable
mention place will be awarded in each class or
subclass at the judges' discretion. Exception -
Class 90 Roses, more than one ribbon may be
awarded. The judges' decisions will be final.

Prizes A prize of \$20 will be awarded for each
of the **Best of Category: Container Plants, Cut
Flowers, Iris and Roses.**

A prize of \$25 will be awarded for the best
Artistic Arrangement and for **Popular Choice.**
The popular choice ribbon will be presented on
Sunday @ 3:30 pm.

**ALL EXHIBITS AND RIBBONS MUST BE
REMOVED BETWEEN 4:10 pm and 4:40
pm on Sunday. No earlier exhibit removal
will be permitted. Proof of ownership of
container and arrangements will be required
when exiting the show.**

ley Music Seminars will not be responsible for
loss or damage to materials, containers, etc.**

Sections One and Two Artistic Arrangement Rules "The River Runs Through It"

- Exhibitor may enter one or more
arrangements.
- Put name on back of arrangements.
- Each arrangement needs temporary mark
indicating FRONT.
- Only natural materials may be used.
- Flowers/plant material must be obtained from
legitimate source.
- Protected plants/flowers not permitted.
- Accessories permitted in all classes.

Section One ~ Arrangements*

Class 1: Bright Valley Sunrise – a primarily red,
yellow and orange arrangement

Class 2: Blue Skies – blue, purple arrangement

Class 3: Clouds Over the Valley – all white
arrangement

Class 4: Farmers Market – an arrangement using
fresh fruits and/or vegetables with other natural
materials

Class 5: Calm Water – a water garden or Ikebana
arrangement using designer's choice of materials

Class 6: Love that Sunset! – an arrangement using
a pink-to-red spectrum of hues in a free style

Class 7: Summertime Fun – an imaginative
arrangement open to men only

Class 8: Green Pastures – an all green colored
arrangement

Class 9: Tiny Treasures – miniature arrangement:
designer's choice of color and materials; no larger
than 6" in any direction

Class 10: On the Dry Side – an arrangement of
succulents and other natural material

Class 11: Under the Valley Sun – bouquet:
designer's choice of color

** Distinction between an arrangement and a bouquet will
be left to the judgment of the Garden Club President.

Class 12: Picnic at the River – tablesetting:
setting for 2; 30" round tabletop; arrangement
as centerpiece (Call Dianne to reserve a table -
only 7 tables available)

Section Two ~ Youth Entries

Class open to children 14 and under only. Size
no larger than specified number of inches in any
direction. All children receive a ribbon.

- Findng Rainbows** – miniature arrangement:
designer's choice of color and materials - 6"
- Picking Posies** – bouquet: designer's choice
of color - 12"
- Playing in the Dirt** – Children's created
potted container - 6"

Section Three ~ Container Plants

- Exhibitor may have up to three (3) entries in
each class or subclass
- All entries must have botanical and/or common
name on entry card
- Exhibitor must provide their own container
- Put name on **back** of containers

one stalk any variety

Class 54: All Annuals ~

3 stems, any color

VINES

Class 55: Clematis ~

3 stems, any color

Class 56: Jasmine ~

3 stems

Class 57: Honeysuckle ~

3 stems, any color

Class 58: Wisteria ~

1 stem, any color

Class 59: All other vines

Section Five ~ Roses

All roses must be NAMED to qualify for 1st prize ribbon or Best of Show.

Class 60:

All hybrid tea roses should be de-budded. Wash buds and leaves, remove any droopy guard petals. Best displayed w/12-18" stem w/leaves.

a. Hybrid Tea ~ single blossom,

1 or 2 sets of leaves/only, ONE bloom per stem

b. Floribunda ~

single flower or spray; any buds must show color

spray w/leaves, any color

one stem, w/leaves

1. white & cream

2. pink

3. red

4. apricot & orange

5. yellow

Section Six ~ Fragrant Roses

- NO OFFICIAL JUDGING

- All roses must be NAMED

- Can be duplicates of roses entered in Section Five

- Any color

- Public judging of Best Fragrance

Fragrant roses may be of any type.

Best displayed w/12-18" stem w/leaves.
