

## TRYC Racing Team Jackets

1. Every junior sailor participating in the TRYC Junior Sailing Program has the opportunity to earn a team jacket by accruing 20 points as outlined here.

A) Qualifying for a Spring Series or Spring Frost Bite Series	3 points
B) Qualifying for a Fall Series or Fall Frost Bite Series	3 points
C) Qualifying for the BBYRA Summer Series	4 points
D) Completing a one-day regatta	1 point
E) Completing a regatta with two or more days of racing	2 points
F) Qualifying for Interclub	2 points
G) Attending a sailing/racing clinic (one day)	1 point
H) Attending a sailing/racing clinic (more than one day)	2 points
2. Parents are responsible for tracking their sailors' progress and must submit a completed form (attached) to the Junior Sailing Committee before a jacket can be awarded. In the case of an event that occurs outside of our 8-week summer sailing program, the Jr. Sailing Coordinator may sign your form.
3. If a sailor completes a season without earning 20 points, the points he/she has accrued can be applied toward the next year. Be sure not to lose the attached form, since it is our only record!
4. Jackets will be awarded to individual sailors at a mutually agreed upon "Meet the Coaches", "Awards Ceremony" or "Galley Night", a sailor MUST be present to receive his jacket and it is expected that he will say a few words, if only to thank the members of the TRYC for their support. There is no cost to the sailor for the jacket.
5. With the exception of double-handed boats, a sailor can only earn points if he is skippering. A sailor CAN earn points by racing in classes of boats that are NOT included in our program. For example, a junior sailor skippering a Flying Scot in a sanctioned regatta may earn points.
6. If you sail a boat that doesn't have a heavy regatta schedule, please take the initiative and work together with your instructor and the Program Director to arrange some informal regattas. For example, Sunfish sailors might get together with Beachwood Yacht Club and Pine Beach Yacht Club to plan a regatta. As well, if your boat isn't sailed currently during the Spring and Fall Series, get three boats together and approach the race committee about it.

### Please Review Special Circumstances:

Before points can be awarded, the following requirements must be considered:

- A. A sailor who is awarded a DNF (did not finish) for capsizing or breakdown qualifies for points; however, a sailor with more than one DNF (did not finish) on any given day of racing does not qualify for points.
- B. A sailor who is awarded a DNF (did not finish) for dropping out of a race does not qualify for points.
- C. A sailor who is awarded a DNS (did not start) for breakdown qualifies for points; however, a sailor with more than one DNS (did not start) on any given day of racing does not qualify for points.
- D. A sailor who is awarded a DNS (did not start) because he chooses not to compete does not qualify for points.
- E. A sailor who is awarded a DSQ (disqualified) for poor sportsmanship does not qualify for points.
- F. A sailor whose behavior on or off the water is deemed inappropriate or unsportsmanlike by a TRYC instructor or Program Director does not qualify for points.
