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## **Get Connected to Skyline News and Resources!**

Are you having difficulty logging in to the SVC Website? Logging in ensures member access to events and the ability to view Members Only information. So, here are a few simple steps to help you get connected:

- Go to [www.skylinevillagechicago.org](http://www.skylinevillagechicago.org). Click on the Member Login link at the upper right corner of the screen.
- DO NOT enter anything in the User name or Password fields yet
- Click on the iForgot my Username/Password link located under the Login button
- In the popup, enter your email address and first name. Click OK button
- You will immediately receive an email with your username and a new, temporary password.
- Go back to [www.skylinevillagechicago.org](http://www.skylinevillagechicago.org). Click on member login. Type in your username and temporary password. You will be asked to provide a new, permanent password for yourself. You can also change your user name if you wish.
- Now, any time you want to log in on that computer, you will need only to click on "member login."

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## **SVC Friday Luncheon Forum Notes**



### **An Enthusiastic Crowd Gathered to Hear Kurt Summers, City Treasurer, at the SVC Friday Lunch Forum - April 29**

SVC hosted Chicago City Treasurer Kurt Summers who enlightened us with information about the City Treasurer's office and exciting new plans for the city.

He explained how the city will benefit from millions of dollars of interest income by placing the city's excess cash (cash not needed to pay bills immediately) in short-term investments instead of the very low interest accounts previously used. In addition, he reported that most of the city's streetlights are not energy-efficient and he reported that a new plan will pay for the improvements by switching to modern, low-energy lights that will reduce the city's energy bills. The new lights will be integrated into the city's 911 system which will enable street lights to flash next to a house calling 911 and increase brightness in high-crime areas.

New construction planned at O'Hare will create hundreds of new jobs, Summers reported. An important part of this project will be to recruit and train as many workers as possible from the city's neighborhoods with high rates of unemployment.

Summers promised to return to SVC to provide updates on the progress of Chicago's new and ongoing projects. The luncheon took place at Ditka's Restaurant and attracted more than 20 attendees. - *Jay Owens, SVC Guest*

Programs include high school job training employing teens and an Assistant Grower for 11-month internships. They are taught sustainable urban farming, marketing and job-readiness skills.

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**Skyline Members Speak.....**

**H.O.M.E. For Seniors**

Have you heard about H.O.M.E. here in Chicago? I hadn't until I was a guest at a recent fundraising dinner to benefit this wonderful organization. Being a part of the Village movement, Skyline Village members are so aware of how important it is to have a strong support system as we age. But, thousands of Chicago seniors have no access to, nor know how to create, such support.

For over 30 years, H.O.M.E. (Housing Opportunities & Maintenance for the Elderly) has helped low-income seniors maintain independence and stay in their homes and communities. Their programs include home upkeep and repair, a shopping bus and moving assistance. One of their most interesting programs is Intergeneration Housing at Good Life Senior Residences, which brings together children, 20-somethings and seniors. Actually, their youngest resident (1½ years old) was in attendance at the dinner. Children visit and "adopt" a grandparent; seniors who either don't have grandchildren or they live far away, can enjoy the company of eager youngsters.

H.O.M.E. also has a program to make repairs for people in their own homes, because so many seniors are living safely in their own community. During fiscal year 2014, H.O.M.E.'s home repair specialists completed 773 repairs in 256 households, many of which were emergencies that could have made it necessary for some seniors to leave their home. Seniors pay a small service fee and reimburse for materials, but the labor is free. Seniors can apply to receive free painting and weatherization for their homes also.
