## **Skyline Village Chicago is Looking for Volunteers**

Skyline Village Chicago is looking for people who are willing to volunteer their time to provide services to Skyline members (volunteers don't need to be a Skyline member to pitch in and help) Volunteers are needed to help in the following ways:

1. grocery shopping or picking up prescriptions for a member
2. accompanying a member to a medical or dental appointment
3. helping a member to order library books on line and picking them up at our Water Tower library
4. visiting a member who would like to have company at home, or in the hospital or rehab facility.

Our volunteers will not be asked to provide transportation, but may accompany members to appointments at the members expense. Prospective volunteers will be interviewed and receive training from a qualified professional.

### **CHICAGO SINAI**

Chicago Sinai conducts an outreach to the Jenner Academy of the Arts, a grade school in the former Cabrini neighborhood, by providing volunteers to tutor students during the week. They also meet with students on Career Day and host Scholars Lunches for high-achieving students. Most of the students are enrolled in the federal school lunch program Monday to Friday but have no access to lunches on weekends. Sinai volunteers provide bag lunches to these children on Friday to take home.

Sinai's Board voted unanimously in 2009 to support the Chicago Coalition to Save Our Mental Health Centers. These facilities have been closing at an alarming rate. They are no longer able to support those in need in their own neighborhoods, much less other areas. Half of the mental health centers closed in 2012. The consequences of untreated mental health can be homelessness, poverty, incarceration, morbidity and death. In 2008, 71% of the River North community (23,500 population) approved a non-binding referendum to pay \$4 of every \$1,000 to expand mental health care in their community. They must now vote on a binding referendum. Thanks to the passage of the Community Expanded Mental Health Services Act of 2011, every neighborhood with a population of 75,000 to 250,000 can now hold such a referendum.

The SVC Book Club was honored to be invited to Lookingglass Theatre Company's office in the Hancock Building to participate in a discussion about their up-coming production of Still Alice. The play is based on the novel by Lisa Genova and is being adapted for the stage by ensemble artist Christine Mary Dunford. It is the intimate story of Professor Alice Howland who at the peak of her career studying the human brain, finds her own mind beginning to falter. Attending the meeting were two other local book groups as well as professionals from The Alzheimers Association, Northwestern Medical Faculty Foundation, Rush Medical Center, and Loyola School of Social Work. Ms. Dunford shared insights into how she adapted the novel for the stage, giving both Alice and Herself a voice. She then had us read from a scene, taking the actor's parts, which gave us a brief, tantalizing taste of the play to come.

True to Lookingglass' commitment to community, we were asked to share ways that the impact of this production might be felt beyond the play itself. We discussed resources and panel discussions about Alzheimers Disease and dementia that will be held in conjunction with the play.
