I've been reflecting on what it means to feel safe in our neighborhood after listening to friends and neighbors talk about their feelings of unease after the recent incidents on Michigan Ave. I thought about it again when my grandchildren visited and I made a conscious decision not to take the subway from the Chicago Ave. station for fear of being harassed.

On Wednesday, May 1, as part of SOAR's First Wednesday series, representatives from the Chicago Police Dept, CTA, Navy Pier, Northwestern University and Loyola University will give a workshop on safety and security and will provide information for an upcoming Safety and Security Strategic Plan. **Manny Martinez**, chair of SOAR's Safety and Security Task Force shared his concern that "If our sense of security is lost, our neighborhood could go down." For those of us who love this neighborhood and all that it means to us, including a sense of safety, we need to take an active role to ensure that we can feel safe walking to Holy Name, using the CTA, loading our transit cards at the Chicago Ave. station., and enjoying all that our Skyline Village Chicago's neighborhood offers us.

Chicago Alternative Policing Strategy (CAPS) meetings are held every other month in precincts across the city and offer an opportunity for the police and community members to come together to solve problems. Our local CAPS meeting, held every other month may be a good place to share our concerns with real life stories, and where we can learn more about what is being done to make us feel safe. The next CAPS Beat meeting in Streeterville is Thursday, May 2, at 7:00 PM at Access Living, 115 W. Chicago Av. Are you interested in organizing an SVC CAPS team? SVC: MORE THAN JUST A BOOK CLUB

Skyline Village Book Group Steps Out of the Box and Onto the Stage

The April 3 meeting of the Skyline Village Chicago Book Group departed from its usual format by considering both the novel *Still Alice* by Lisa Genova and the LookingGlass Theatre adaptation of the novel by Christine Dunford, a member of the LookingGlass Theatre Ensemble.

We were extremely fortunate to have Andy White, Artistic Director of LookingGlass Theatre join us to lead our discussion. He brought a scene from the production that opens at LookingGlass in April and led the group through a reading of the scene which each member reading a part. Andy started the discussion of the book by considering how that segment of the adaptation captured the essence of Lisa Genova's work and the changes that Christine Dunford made. Andy's discussion about how they approached the play, how it was selected, LookingGlass's relationship with the author, and the outreach that the company has made with the professional community to develop pre and post-performance conversations added another dimension to our discussion of the book. The topic was difficult (early onset Alzheimers) but touched on many important themes.

The Skyline Book Group includes a diverse group of active readers, many of whom had suggestions for future reading. The titles selected for the next 3 months follow. Meetings take place on the first Wednesday of each month at 3:00 p.m. at Prentice Women's Hospital, 2nd floor cafeteria in one of the areas on the Chicago Ave. side.
