News You Can Use

ARE YOU COVERED BY MEDICARE?

Hospital admission vs. observation... do you know the difference?

If you are covered under Medicare and need to go to the hospital, you need to know if your doctor is actually admitting you, or are you being sent for 'observation'? The difference may have a significant impact on your out-of-pocket costs. Just because you are staying in a hospital bed and receiving hospital-type services, you may be there under 'observation'. Your doctor should be able to tell you. The Illinois Hospital Association has published a brochure outlining the differences:

"An observation stay is billed under outpatient services (under Medicare this would be under Part B) while an Inpatient admission is billed under inpatient services (under Medicare this would be billed under Part A). Since observation stays are billed as an outpatient service, your insurance co-pays and deductibles, along with any additional costs, will probably be based on the outpatient terms of your policies.

Your out-of-pocket costs may change depending on whether your stay is designated as observation or full inpatient admission. Therefore, any costs from a nursing home following an observation stay or any inpatient hospital stay that is less than three days are the responsibility of the patient and will not be covered by Medicare as a Part B service."
