These connections extend out to our community partners. We are excited about our most recent collaboration with Northwestern Memorial Hospital. Skyline Village Chicago is included in a grant that geriatrician Dr. Lee Lindquist recently received from the Patient Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI). The name of the project is Advance Planning for Home Services for Seniors. The Skyline Board of Directors and our Volunteer Committee are excited about working on this project and will be telling you more after July 19th, when the project team holds its first meeting.

Finally, I recently moderated a panel discussion about financial insecurity and the elderly. Gay Roberts joined me at the seminar where we spoke to Director of the Illinois Department on Aging, John Holton, about Skyline Village Chicago and the important role that Villages play in helping older people take charge of their lives. The panel discussion highlighted the importance of individual planning as well as the implications of policy decisions on financial security/insecurity. This fall, Skyline will be holding sessions on this topic that we hope will be of interest to you, our members, and neighbors.

Skyline's recently introduced Neighbor Helping Neighbor volunteer assistance program is rapidly winning kudos from members. A phone bank has been established to assist members in getting help from member volunteers when and where they need it. Guidelines for such services include helping with grocery and pharmacy shopping, accompanying members to hospital and doctor appointments, picking up books at the Water Tower library, and visits to homes, nursing homes or hospitals.

Dear Phyllis, Nancy and everyone involved:

I have been very happy with Skyline Village in its first level of performance as a social activity and opportunity to meet neighbors. How fortunate for me that our Village now has wonderful volunteers who help each other through the Neighbor Helping Neighbor program, just in time to meet my need.

Years ago my gastroenterologist let me take a taxi and go back to my office after my periodic routine procedure. But Northwestern no longer allows this. I called Nancy Almquist, co-chair of the Neighbor Helping neighbor Program and without hesitation, she volunteered to pick me up herself. Not only did the hospital release me because she was there, but also she and I stopped for coffee on the way home and now I have a new friend.

Although I hope I won't need this service very often in the near
