2) RULES

All races will be sailed on Lake Jacomo. Races shall be governed by the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), as adopted by US Sailing and the Sailing Instructions.

ORGANIZING AUTHORITY: Jacomo Sailing Club

3) ELIGIBLE SKIPPERS

The principal helmsman shall be a Racing Member, Boat Share, Boat Share+, Cruiser Member or Junior racing member in good standing and meet all the requirements of the JSC by-laws.

4) FLEET STATUS

Will be determined as per the JSC club by-laws.

5) RC ASSIGNMENTS

The races are to be run by the Race Committee of the Day as assigned by the Jacomo Sailing Club and designated in the JSC "Sailing Instructions". The Race Committee shall record the starting and finishing times for all entrants.

6) LAKE JACOMO REQUIREMENTS

All yachts must meet the requirements of the Jackson County Parks and Recreation Department as they apply.

7) STARTING TIMES

A) Spring Opener and all Spring and Commodore Club Series Races

First Race: 1:30 P.M

Second Race: Shall immediately follow the previous race.

B) 'Round the Lake Race:

First Race: 1:30 PM All yachts have the same start (J Flag)

C) Saturday Cruiser Series

First race: 1:30 PM

D) Saturday Cruiser Series Spring and Fall Regatta

First Race: 12:00 PM

Subsequent Races: Shall immediately follow the previous race

E) Bernard P Kuse Portsmouth Handicap (BPK)

First Race: 12:00 PM

Second and Third Race: Shall immediately follow the previous race

F) Jacomo Sailing Club Invitational Regatta

First Race: 10:00 AM

Subsequent Races: Shall immediately follow the previous race

G) Wyant Cup

First Race: TBD - See separate NOR and SI

Subsequent Races: Shall immediately follow the previous race

H) JSC Novice Skipper Regatta

First Race: 12:00 PM

Second and Third Race: Shall immediately follow the previous race

I) John Kling Memorial Transjac

First race: 1:30 P.M. All yachts have the same start (J Flag)

J) Wednesday Night Sail

Sails start at 6:30 pm to 8:00 pm

8) COURSES TO BE SAILED

a) TYPES

T	=	Triangle
W	=	Windward and leeward
I	=	Windward, leeward and windward, with start and finish in the middle of leg
M	=	Triangle with start and finish in the middle of leg
O	=	Triangle followed by windward, leeward and windward (Olympic). Finish at MK 1
G	=	Triangle followed by windward and leeward (Gold Cup). Finish at MK 3
F	=	"O" with start and finish in the middle of the leg (modified Olympic)
C	=	Catamaran triangle with start and finish in the middle of the leg

b) COURSE BOARD INFORMATION

You will see this information on the Race Committee course board, located on the stern of the Committee Boat (read course board top to bottom per column, each column is a start):

First Box	Fleet Start
Second Box	Compass Heading to First Mark
Third Box	Course Diagram Signal
Fourth Box	Number of laps or partial laps.

Red or Green plaque on the stern of the committee boat will indicate port or starboard mark rounding. Red leaves the mark port, Green leaves the mark to starboard.

c) LONG AND SHORT COURSES

The race committee may opt to run a long course for boats with a DPN of 88.0 or lower and a short course for boats with a DPN of 88.1 or higher. See Sailing Instructions Addendum B for DPN schedule. If multiple courses are used code flag "Q" will be flown from the committee boat and separate marks will be used for the number 1 or 3 mark. The absence of code flag "Q" will indicate one common course for all yachts. All rounding marks are inflatables in two different colors. A YELLOW CYLINDRICAL mark for the SHORT course. An ORANGE CYLINDRICAL mark for the LONG course. ORANGE CYLINDRICAL mark for all COMMON marks.

9) RACE INFORMATION

a) SPRING AND COMMODORE SERIES RACES

The Race Committee will conduct two multiple day club race series, the Spring and Commodore Series, designated dates and race number are listed in 1A of this NOR. The race committee will record all participants' scores throughout each Series and a Champion for each fleet will be named for each Series. Trophies will be awarded to each fleet according the Chapter X B of the club Bylaws. The race committee will have discretion to set course length and type with the goal of concluding racing about 4:00 pm each day. All races in the Club Series will be started back to back.

b) SATURDAY CRUISER RACES

This is a season long race series, 6 races total, dates and race number are listed in 1D of this NOR. Eligible participants must join JSC as a Cruiser Member, Boat Share or Boat Share + Member and sail a Cruiser type of yacht (defined in the broadest terms possible). The purpose of this series is to encourage participation of Cruiser type yachts. The race committee will set the course the course for the day. One start for all yachts ("J" flag warning code). All yachts will be scored Portsmouth Handicap, any yacht not finishing in the time limit will be scored DNF, (Finish in place option will be excluded from this series, this changes rule 11B in this NOR and 15.2 of the SI), if no yacht finishes within the time limit the race

committee shall abandon the race (RRS 35) and that race will be excluded from the series. The race committee shall record all finishers and total series to determine overall series champion. Trophies will be awarded at the JSC banquet at the end of the season as per the Jacomo Sailing Club by-laws. One keeper trophy per 4 boats entered with a minimum first and second place award.

c) SPECIAL RACES

1) Spring Opener

This is the first sailing event of our season. It is designed to prepare participants both racers and race committee for the season ahead. This event does not count toward the overall Championship and there is no trophy awarded. We will conduct 5 starts, participants will round a windward mark and finish downwind then reset for the next start.

2) 'Round the Lake Race

The 'Round the Lake Race is a long distance race similar to the Transjac held at the end of the season. The RC will attempt, but is not required, to incorporate the following items into the racecourse. Windward leg to the best possible location and to match or exceed the normal racing distance for a leg of this type. Windward finish in the best possible location and to match or exceed the normal race distance for a leg of this type. One leg of the race at least ½ the distance up the arm of the lake known as "A" arm. One leg of the race at least ½ the distance up the cove of the lake known as "Liggett Cove." One race mark set a reasonable distance from and directly in front of the Lake Jacomo dam. The starting time for the 'Round the Lake Race is 1:30 PM and there is one race. Certificate trophies will be awarded 1 per 4 boats participating and awarded at the JSC banquet meeting at the end of the season, minimum first and second place awarded.

3) Saturday Cruiser Series Spring and Fall Regatta

These two regattas will be designed with the special needs of cruiser type yachts in mind. See separate NOR for these events. Please obtain this NOR from the public posting at the bulletin board, the club web site (jacomosailingclub.org) or from the Rear Commodore (admin@vectorscope.net)

4) Bernard P. Kuse Portsmouth Handicap Championship

This intra club regatta will determine the winner of the Bernard P. Kuse Portsmouth HC, which is held as a mid season event. The trophies will be awarded at the JSC banquet at the end of the season as per the Jacomo Sailing Club by-laws. One keeper trophy per 4 boats entered with a minimum first and second place award. The JSC board may elect to divide the fleet into "Open" and "Novice" divisions. The race guidelines and descriptions are as follows. All yachts will sail the same course and are scored on a Portsmouth handicap basis. It will be at the PRO's discretion to set the course of the particular race of the day. The races (3) will be scheduled for a Sunday during the normal racing season.

The starting time is as follows:

First Race: 12:00 PM (Noon)

Second Race and Third Race shall immediately follow the previous race

All yachts have the same start (J Flag).

Social event to follow the third race, see race committee for details.

5) JSC Invitational Regatta

This is an open regatta with a fleet racing format designed to promote one design racing. Three like boats will constitute a fleet; dissimilar boats will sail in a Portsmouth Handicap Fleet. See separate NOR and SI for this event. Please obtain these documents from the public posting on the bulletin board, the club web site (jacomosailingclub.org) or from the Rear Commodore (admin@vectorscope.net)

6) Wyant Cup

This is an intra club regatta designed to demonstrate a sailors sailing skills using various yachts and unique racing formats. The winner of this regatta will be deemed club champion and their name listed on the Wyant Cup trophy, presented at the season end awards banquet. See separate NOR and SI for this event. 7) JSC Novice Skipper Regatta

This is an intra club regatta designed to familiarize new sailors to club racing. See separate NOR for this event. Please obtain this NOR from the public posting on the bulletin board, the club web site (jacomosailingclub.org) or from the Rear Commodore (admin@vectorscope.net)

8) John Kling Memorial Transjac

The John Kling Memorial Transjac race is held as the last event of the sailing season. The trophies will be awarded at the JSC banquet meeting at the end of the season. One keeper trophy per 4 boats entered with a minimum of first and second place award. The Don MacClaymont trophy is awarded to the second place finisher. The JSC board may elect to divide the fleet into "Open" and "Novice" divisions. All yachts will sail the same course and are scored Portsmouth Handicap. It will be at the RC's discretion to set the course of the particular race of the day. The RC will attempt, but is not required, to incorporate the following items into the racecourse. Windward leg to the best possible location and to match or exceed the normal racing distance for a leg of this type. Windward finish in the best possible location and to match or exceed the normal race distance for a leg of this type. One leg of the race at least ½ the distance up the arm of the lake known as "A" arm. One leg of the race at least ½ the distance up the cove of the lake known as "Liggett Cove." One race mark set a reasonable distance from and directly in front of the Lake Jacomo dam. The starting time for the John Kling Memorial Transjac is 1:30 PM

d) WEDNESDAY NIGHT "SAIL INTO SUMMER"

Wednesday night sailing is primarily a social event; however the event host may include sailing games, skills exercises, casual racing, coaching/mentoring or other activities to promote the club, its activities and sailing in general. No score keeping will be made and no activity will count toward a trophy. The designated dates are listed in 1D of this NOR, times listed in 7I.

10) TROPHIES

Club Series races:

The Jacomo Sailing Club will award trophies based on the average number of starters of each fleet as per Jacomo Sailing Club by-laws. See Chapter X (Ten) of the By-laws.

Special races and Saturday Cruiser:

The Jacomo Sailing Club will award trophies one keeper trophy per 4 boats entered with a minimum of first and second place award.

Trophies for all races will be awarded as per the Jacomo Sailing Club by-laws and as listed in this Notice of Race.

11) SCORING

The fleets will designate the scoring system used for Club Series races.

All Series and Special races will use Appendix A with the following exception, Finish in Place (FNP) = # of starters. This changes RRS A4.1, A4.2 and A11. Ties will be broken using Appendix A.8 of the current RRS. If the club board designates a novice division this will be scored separately from the open division. Completion of one race constitutes an event, all races will count.
