AGING IN PLACE - WHITMAN VILLAGE? It's for those who want to see an age-diverse active community. About a year ago, the AARP Bulletin and other publications carried stories about Beacon Hill Village, a self-organized, self-help corporation designed to help home owners and residents facing diminishing mobility, chronic illness, and isolation remain in their homes, rather than make the move to assisted living. A similar group, Capitol Hill Village, was covered March 10 in the Washington Post.

Interested in talking about the same concept for the Whitman community? Even though this may not be you now, you may still be interested in exploring the concept. Someday, we'll all be there. People in need could be elders or others who need help getting to the doctor, the grocery store, maintaining their homes, meeting with friends, and the myriad of life's little chores.

Beacon Hill Village organized, incorporated, and hired at least one person to help them address these needs. They raise money through memberships & fees to pay expenses of the corporation. Throughout the process Beacon Hill worked with a group from MIT which wrote a manual, available for several hundred dollars, used widely across the United States in organizing similar groups.




