## Junior Tennis Program Schedule



The summer session begins June 16<sup>th</sup> and tennis at Carderock Springs will be in full swing! This summer there will be some new programs available along with some that were here last year. Below there is a description of all the camps that are available this summer. There is a camp for every level! This is going to be an exciting summer at Carderock Springs! Hope to see you on the courts!

Unlike many other tennis facilities in the area, the Director of Tennis, Nitin Deodhar, will oversee and often times will be on court with each group during the Summer Programs. Nitin Deodhar is a certified United States Tennis Professional at the highest level. Students will receive quality instruction from a knowledgeable staff, who truly understand the game of tennis.

### Tournament Training/Advanced Junior Team:

This clinic is equivalent to the World Class Academy conducted last year. The clinic is designed for ranked USTA players or High School Team players. Clinic will feature warm-up, stretching, live-ball drills, fitness, and matches. This intense three hour a day program is a sure way to improve tremendously over the summer months.

### Players on the Rise/Intermediate Junior Team:

The Players on the Rise camp is a full day clinic designed to help make a player more tournament ready. This camp is intended for those players who want to become tournament players or high school players. The 5 hour camp (half day and one hour day option is available) includes warm-up, stretching, fed-ball drills, live-ball drills, swimming, lunch (bring own lunch or snack bar), and matches. A perfect camp for players who want to go to the next level while having fun and enjoying other activities at the same time!

### Up and Comers:

A great camp for players to master the basics of tennis. Up and Comers is designed to develop a proper understanding of rules, scoring, technique, and etiquette. This camp will also feature other activities such as swimming, basketball, and soccer. However, a large majority of the 5 hour camp (half day and one hour day option is available) will be placed on tennis. Schedule will include warm-up, stretching, fed ball drills, games, lunch (bring own or snack bar), and point play. An excellent way for a child to spend the summer!

### Tiny Tots

This one hour clinic is a great way for children to learn or continue to learn the core basics of the game of tennis. Children ages 4-7 will learn proper stroke technique, footwork, as well as rules of the game. This clinic is a great way to begin the lifelong sport of tennis! Tiny tots runs from 9-10am, Monday-Friday, therefore the 6 and 7 year olds can jump right into the Summer Fun program which runs from 10-3pm!

***THE GRATEFUL SHRED***, Saturday, June 7, 9 am - noon, Clara Barton CC

Yes, a Grateful Shred shredding party at the Clara Barton Community Center! Avoid fraud or identity theft—and clean out your files. Bring those no-longer needed bills, statements, letters—anything with private, confidential, or sensitive information that you want to get rid of--*securely!* All-Shred, a noted firm in Frederick, MD, will provide a mobile shredding truck—inside it is a cross-cut shredder that cuts your pages into tiny paper chips. The shredded chips are then baled and sent to paper plants to be recycled.



All-Shred reports that along with office paper they have no problem shredding rubber bands, folders, binder clips, hanging folders (even with metal strips), and labels BUT they don't do newspapers, 3-ring binders, cardboard, heavy plastic, boxes, trash, floppy disks, or CDs.

We ask that you donate \$5 per box of paper (that means a one-cubic-foot storage box, 12 x 13 inches) or the equivalent. Don't have quite a box full? You can have a half-box or the equivalent shredded for \$3 or a quarter-box for \$2. And there'll be coffee and donuts available. Need more information? Call the Clara Barton Center, 301-229-0010.

## Green Neighbors

The 7 week Carderock vs. Cabin John scrap metal recycling competition ended with a total of nearly 17 tons of scrap metal collected. That's 17 tons of metal which can now be processed for recycling and shipped to steel mills and manufacturers. The metal will then be re-used and made into new appliances, car and engine parts, guardrails and many other useful items.

The Cabin John neighborhood collected 60 percent of the total, winning the contest with 20,284 pounds. Hearty congratulations to Cabin John!

How do these numbers compare when considering the number of households and pounds collected per household? Math can be useful and fun, yes? So let's do the math:

b. Number of Households	700 ?	500 ?	1,200 ?
c. Pounds per Household pph (a/b)	28.98	26.96	28.14 pph

If Cabin John has 700 households and Carderock Springs has 500, then each household collected an average of 29 or 27 pounds of scrap metal per household! Hurrah!! Both Cabin John and Carderock Springs truly are winners for raising awareness of recycling, reusing, and reducing.

Collecting over 25 pounds of scrap metal per household in less than 2 months is a lot. Who would have thought that making such a small change in your daily habits - saving bent nails, rusty screws, unused hangers, screw tops of spaghetti jars, busted toasters - would make such a difference?
