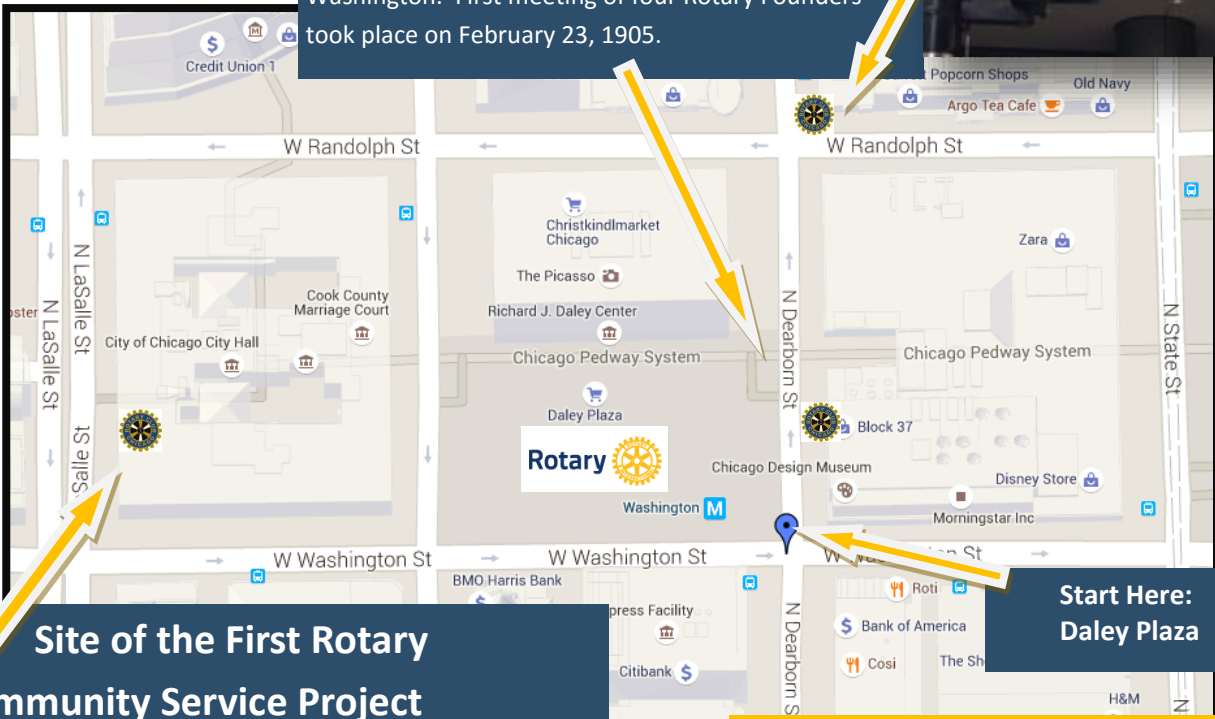
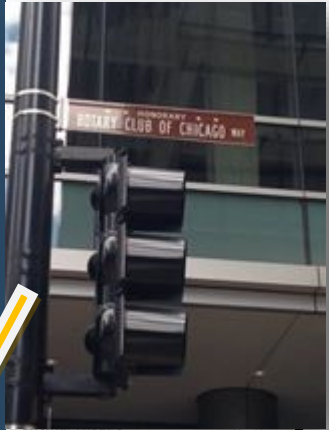


The world's first service club.

Rotary Club of Chicago Honorary Street Sign and Unity Building Sidewalk Sign

Rotary Club of Chicago Way is the honorary street; sign on corner of Randolph and Dearborn.

Founding of Rotary, ROTARY/One is noted by a street/sidewalk plaque at the site of the Unity Building, now Block 37. On Dearborn, east side, 75 feet north of Washington. First meeting of four Rotary Founders took place on February 23, 1905.

Rotary Club of Chicago, The World's First Service Club, orchestrated a collaboration for the first public bathroom in the City of Chicago at the northeast corner of N. LaSalle and W. Washington Streets. A marking / stain of the structure, remains today on the City of Chicago City Hall. Established October 24, 1907.
