



Get Ready to Vote!

November 2, 2021, 7 am – 8 pm

Who Is Eligible to Vote?

- All US citizens 18 or older as of November 2, 2021 and a PA resident for 30 days before the election, and
- Have a PA driver's license or a PennDOT ID or a social security number

Register by October 18 to Vote in the Nov. 2 Election.

- Register online at Vote.PA.gov using your PA driver's license or PennDOT ID number.
- Or, download and print a paper registration form, or request one from your local county elections office. You can use the last four digits of your Social Security Number, or a PA driver's license, or a PennDOT ID as ID when using a paper registration form.

To Vote in Person:

- Polls are open from 7am-8pm on Election Day, November 2.
- Bring voter registration card or another valid ID.
- Don't leave without voting. You may request a provisional ballot.

To Vote by Absentee or No-Excuse Mail-in Ballot:

Don't forget the stamp!



(1) Complete a Ballot Application

- Contact the Allegheny County Board of Elections* or
- Download and print one online at Vote.PA.gov.
- Complete an online application at Vote.PA.gov. You must have a PA Driver's License or PennDOT ID to apply online.

(2) Complete Your Mail-in Ballot or Absentee Ballot and Mail It

- Your Mail-in or Absentee Ballot will be mailed to you once ballots are printed.
- Check the status of your Mail-in Ballot at Vote.PA.Gov/mailballotstatus. "Pending" status means your application is approved and your ballot will be mailed.
- Return it **IMMEDIATELY** to the Allegheny County Elections Division to be **received by November 2nd, 8 pm**. Be sure to **seal** the secrecy envelope, **insert it** in the official return envelope, **seal, sign, and date** the outside of the official return envelope, and **mail it immediately**.

Who Will Be on My Ballot?

- **Statewide Judges:** Supreme, Superior, Commonwealth Courts
- **Pittsburgh:** Mayor, half of City Council, half of School Board
- **Allegheny County:** Sheriff, half of County Council, half of School Boards, half of Municipal Councils, ten Allegheny County Court of Common Pleas Judges, Local Magisterial Judges



Remember these important deadlines:

- **Oct 18:** Last day to register to vote
- **Oct 26:** Last day to apply for mail-in or absentee ballot
- **Nov 2:** Election day. Vote in person 7am – 8pm
- **Nov. 2:** Mail-in or absentee ballots must be received by 8pm.

Postmarks do not count! Mail Early!
