



Get Ready to Vote!

November 2, 2021, 7 am – 8 pm



Who Is Eligible to Vote?

- All US citizens age 18 or older as of November 2, 2021
- PA residents for 30 days prior to November 2, 2021

Register by October 18 to Vote in the Nov. 2 Election.

Register online at Vote.PA.gov using your PA driver's license or PennDOT ID number. You can also register, either with these IDs or with the last four digits of your Social Security Number, on a print registration form, downloaded from that website or requested from your local county elections office*. Check your voter registration status at Vote.PA.gov.

To Vote by Absentee or Mail-in Ballot:



- **Apply** online or download printed form at Vote.PA.gov, or request one from your local county elections office*. **DEADLINE OCTOBER 26** for **receipt** by your elections office*.
- **Complete and mail your ballot:** Place your ballot in the secrecy envelope, seal it, and place it into official envelope. Complete all information on the back of the official envelope and sign the declaration. **DEADLINE NOVEMBER 2** by 8 pm for **receipt** by your elections office*. Postmarks do not count.

To Vote In-Person:

Polls are open from 7am-8pm on Election Day, **NOVEMBER 2**. Bring voter registration card or another valid ID. **Don't leave without voting.** You may request a provisional ballot.

Remember These Important Deadlines:

Mail Early. Postmarks do not count!



- **October 18:** Last day to register to vote.
- **October 26:** Last day to apply for mail-in or absentee ballot.
- **November 2:** Election Day. Mail-in or absentee ballots to be received by 8pm.

Who Is on Your Ballot?



Running for office this year are candidates for Statewide Supreme Court, Superior Court and Commonwealth Court Judges; 17 candidates for 10 positions on the Allegheny County Court of Common Pleas; local Magisterial Judges; Allegheny County Sheriff and 1/2 of Allegheny County Council; Pittsburgh Mayor and 1/2 of Pittsburgh City Council; 1/2 of the Pittsburgh School Board, 1/2 of every other School Board in the County, and 1/2 of every municipal or borough council.

Paper Ballots and Pens!



Beginning in 2020, all Pennsylvania elections systems are using paper ballots (except for those individuals who need or prefer to use a ballot marking device.) Paper ballots are less vulnerable to hacking and provide a paper trail that can be manually audited and recounted, ensuring ballots can be accurately tallied even in the face of a cyberattack or a mishap. Results from our previous machines could not be audited.

Be an Elections Poll Worker

You can demonstrate civic pride and serve your community. Earn \$150 or \$175 on Election Day plus \$20 for training.
