Doug Sherman (our volunteer that records each member's ride mileage now) will continue to be the ride "mileage keeper" until this new method has been implemented.

Currently, Doug is collecting all the ride sheets as usual. We are working on an interim way to post mileage on our website; [www.biketcba.org](http://www.biketcba.org), until the new Club Express component is finished. Please be patient, and we will notify you when the mileage is available to view. We have your miles total, and you will be getting credit toward your Ride Incentive for 2016. (Please refrain from e-mailing Doug and asking what your total miles are to date.) Thank you!

Advocacy Committee: Mike Unsworth submitted his report via email.

## Light Show Aftermath

I'd like to thank everyone at the May club meeting for being so gracious and patient while we distributed all the lights. I hope that everyone ended up with something they can use to increase their safety while riding.

Now that I've gotten through the hard part of the adventure, giving away all the lights and stuff, I'm now at the point that every computer nerd hates, maintenance. Yup, there are going to be people out there who want a light and then found out that they don't know how to install it, charge it, or generally replace the batteries. That's expected, so I'd like to offer my help to anyone who has questions regarding the lights, or help in dealing with unexpected issues. I've already been asked some interesting questions so here's my best answers in case you are wondering the same thing.

? "How long will my battery last?" Well, like most things scientific, it depends. The small four cell batteries that I handed out with most of the lights are 4800mAh batteries, composed of four 18660 batteries. That being said they will deplete fastest on high beam then lower settings and last the longest on flashing. I have used the two led SolarStorm lights on high using the 4800mAh battery for two hours without any loss of light output. The three led SolarStorms have lasted an hour, but that's the longest I've ridden with one so I'm not sure how long it will go without loss of output. Most of the lights have circuitry that automatically drops the light intensity to low when they are down to 20% of their capacity. The larger lights, 7000 lumen to 18000 lumen draw sufficient power to require a much larger battery. If you received one of these lights along with the small battery pack, please contact me if you need the larger battery.

If you're of the scientific nature and you want to help provide us with some data you can e-mail me with your test results. Just make sure you send me a photo of the light, so I can ID it properly, and the amount of time you use it on both high and low settings. That way I'll be able to compile a chart so people will know if they need to upgrade their battery based on the intended length of their nite stalker rides.

? "I forgot to grab an extra 8.4v charger for my office and as you know

every ounce counts so how do I get another charger?" Well, I've snipped some more chargers so all you have to do is e-mail me with your name, address and phone. Once I get the chargers I'll either drop it off at your house while riding around town, or I'll call you for a pickup. Simple, huh?

? "I've already used my light and the battery doesn't last as long as I need it to last. What now?" You can obtain a larger battery from me, if I have one available. If not just send me your name, e-mail, address and phone and I'll contact you to determine just how much juice you need. If I have the right spare then I'll get it to you as in the above points. On the other hand if I don't have it then we'll work out a plan to get one. That could be you taking the initiative and using the MyiBidder program to snipe one, or can try to do it for you as part of my regular snipping. The latter option may take awhile, like a month, so you'll have to decide how you want to proceed.

? "I need additional tail lights. How can I get a few more?" Well, I'm down to just three tail lights and I'm not sure if I have the brackets to mount them to your bike. Two will clip to a bag, or your belt and one looks like it has a seat post mount. The fastest way to solve your problem is to visit one of the sponsors of the 2nd Annual Greater Lansing Bike Movie Night, Riverfront Cycle, Denny's Central Park Bicycles, Evergreen Cycles and Repair, Eric's Cycling and Fitness, or MSU Bikes. They all carry a good supply of rear lights that should meet your needs. If you need something special then e-mail me and I'll see if I can help.

? "Will TCBA have any night rides?" Ah, I guess that's a possibility for a ride, so why don't you start one? Heck, I might even show up! The other option is the Lansing Bike Party, <https://www.facebook.com/groups/lansingbikeparty>, which is a fun group of people that ride to various places to eat, drink and be merry. I've ridden with them before and they're a neat batch of people to ride with and have fun.

## DALMAC Fund Grant Summary

The Tri-County Bicycle Association has awarded \$1,362,881 in DALMAC Fund grants from 1986 to 2016. The 2016 grants awarded are:

**Advent House of Lansing**, \$3,042 in TCBA General Funds for bicycle lights and locks for participants in homeless program. Presentation by Toni Townsend.

**Adventure Cycling Association** based in Missoula, MT, \$6,500 towards a \$57,800 project to sign US Bike Route 35 in Michigan. Presentation by Kerry Irons.

**Detroit Eastside Community Collaborative** in Detroit, \$4,500 to support a \$15,000 Earn-A-Bike program operated in conjunction with Back Alley Bikes of Detroit. Presentation by Yvonne Rucker.

**Kids Repair Program of Lansing**, \$7,500 in TCBA General Funds toward their \$13,189 Youth Bicycle Education program. Presentation by Dave Meade.

**League of Michigan Bicyclists** based

in Lansing, \$7,000 towards a \$13,500 project to bicycle education videos for police, drivers and bicyclists. Presentation by John Lindenmayer.

**Michigan Trails and Greenways** based in Lansing, \$5,000 towards a \$25,000 project to spearhead the Great Lake to Lake trail development in St. Clair County. Presentation by Nancy Krupiarz.

**PEAC (Program to Educate All Cyclists)** in Ypsilanti, \$3,000 in support of their \$132,550 bicycle education program for persons with disabilities. Presentation by John Waterman.

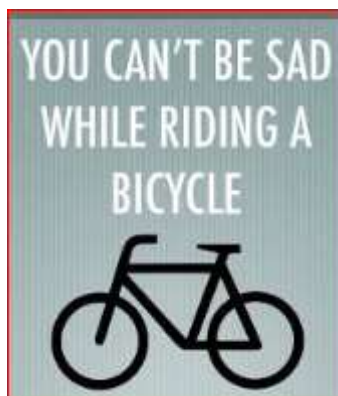
The weekly Called in Ride e-mails will also discontinue, as all the Rides for TCBA would be on the Event Calendar via the Ride Coordinator.
