HEATH, Texas — Gordy Bowers, the 1988 U.S. Olympic sailing coach, took a first in Sunday's race to hold on to his lead over Bob Biver, and win the C-Scow division of the Silver Anniversary Black Tie Regatta on Lake Ray Hubbard on Sunday.

Bowers, of Minnetonka, Minn., finished with 4,407 points. Biver, of Pewaukee, Wis., had 4,253 and Jack Strohm, of Minneapolis, finished third with 4,033.

Bowers has attended the Black Tie nine times and has won four titles. The C-Scows used the high-point system, with the winner of a race receiving 1,000 points.

The 18-25 mph winds helped Kelly Gough win the title in the M-20 class. Gough, a Dallas native who is living in Irvine, Calif., was in second after Saturday's races but managed to keep one boat between him and Chuck Gergen of Minneapolis to clinch the title. Bill Leonard of Dallas had an outside chance to win but settled for third.

Gough and his father, Bob, are the reigning national M-20 champions and won the division at last year's Black Tie.

John Porter of Chicago clinched his third consecutive title in the A-Scow division after Saturday's racing. The sister-brother team of Kim and Manley Haines of Pewaukee, Wis., came in first on Sunday to capture second place overall, ahead of David Chute of Wayzata, Minn.

Scott Ripley, of Zenda, Wis., placed first in the MC class, ahead of runner-up Ernie French of Lexington, Neb.

Regatta chairman Roy J. McCarrroll and his staff received praise from the sailors, many of whom traveled from northern states to compete in their first race of year.
