Issue Teams:

<u>Voter Service</u>: voter registration drives (VRDs), ballot issue research and education, help at candidate forums, VOTE 411 website and more. *A good place to begin your involvement in the League!*

<u>National Popular Vote</u>: educate and advocate for the passage of the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact in the 2019 Colorado General Assembly.

<u>Social Policy</u>: issues are meeting basic human needs (including living wage), immigration and rights of non-citizens, and equality of opportunity. *Living wage is a current priority in the county!*

<u>Voting Methods</u>: educate and advocate for voting methods, including alternatives to the current system of plurality voting, or "winner-take-all".
